John Iannozzi, Esq suspended the public meeting and proceeded to a public hearing which he presented exhibits of letters, proof of public and copies to the law library of ordinances regarding a three -member Shade Tree Commission. Mr. Iannozzi opened for questions from Council which Mrs. Snizavich questioned the language of Chair and Vice Chair and requested that it be changed to Chairperson. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that it would not be a problem to make a minor change. No questions were presented from the public.

2. Mr. Khal Hassan has two items before Council this evening. The first item is a storm water grant. The Borough has a storm water issue at the end of Church Street. Mr. Hassan would need to a motion to move forward

Mr. Hassan wanted to go discuss a land development application for Discovery Labs which is located behind GSK and the majority of the build would be in West Conshohocken Borough. Applicant is seeking relief from steep slope. Mr. Hassan indicated that this is a laboratory. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that council members would have to vote against, for or stay neutral. Ed Campbell, attorney for Discovery Labs was present and provided information for use of the building. Mr. Iannozzi advised that his recommendation would be to remain neutral with conditions. Roll call vote was taken in which all council members voted to remain neutral.

Mr. Hassan wanted to update council on land development 233-237 Moorehead Ave. New developer wanted to move forward with this project. Escrow needed to be updated and a Professional Service Agreement was signed. A pre-construction meeting will be held with developer, contractors and members of the Borough.

Mr. Hassan wanted to discuss a zoning application for 218 Brittmuir which was before Council a few years ago. The application was denied due to the steep slope issues. This application would be for a single home. Mr. Iannozzi suggested that Council remain neutral. Mr. Blumenthal opened up for questions. Mr. Blumenthal asked for a roll call vote and all council members unanimously voted to remain neutral

Mr. Hassan discussed a zoning application at 1008-1010 Matsonford Road, combining two parcels to build a 5-story self-storage unit. Attorney Rose Weiss was present to represent In-Site Storage. Mr. Blumenthal opened the floor to any questions from Council and Mr. Greenstein expressed his concerns with traffic which was explained further by applicant. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that no action is needed but applicant is present to explain use.

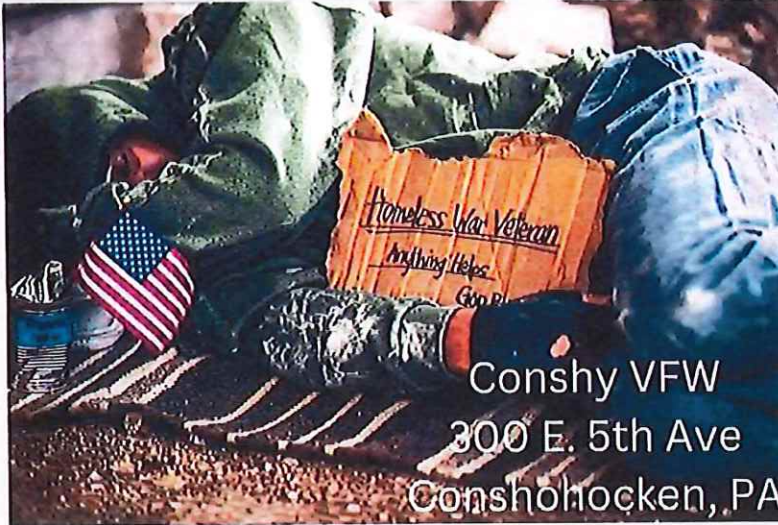

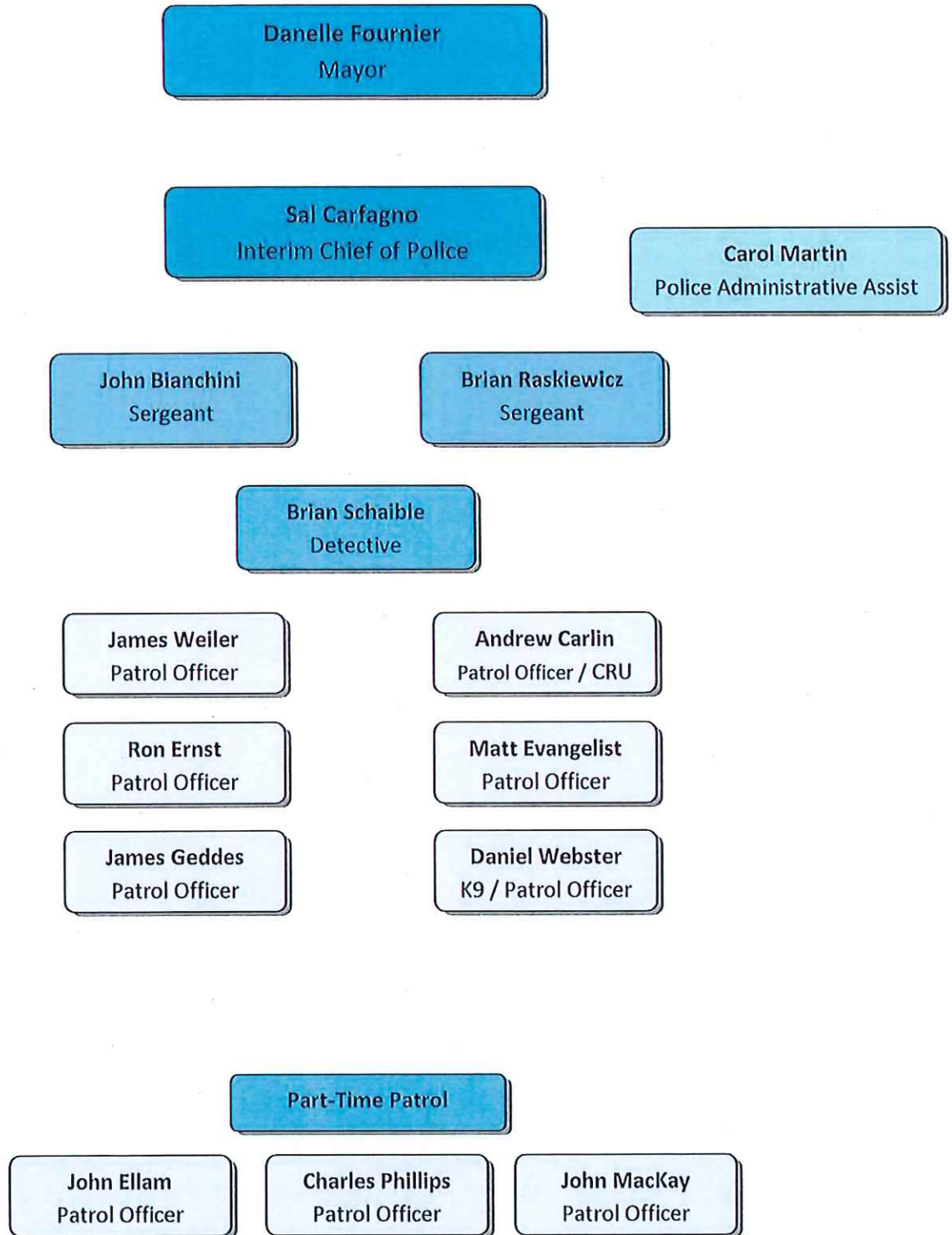

The Police Department has completed its budget request for 2023 and is working with the Public Safety Committee, the Borough Manager and Borough Council to finalize it.

PowerDMS

The Police Department's online policy and training program is being set up for everyday use of the Department's new Policies & Procedures. We are also exploring PowerDMS for all Police Department Training Programs and Testing Assignments.

Policy Manual (Aspirant Consulting Group)

The Aspirant Consulting Group continues to write the Police Department's Policies and Procedures Manual.

Training

- K9 Officer Dan Webster continues to train with K9 Lolli monthly.
- All of the Department's Officers have completed their mandatory update training assignments for this year. Mandatory training consisted of Legal Updates, Use of Force, Understanding Bias and Control Tactics.
- Officers are in the process of completed their annual mandatory First & CPR training.
- All the Department's Officers continue to participate in daily online training sessions through Police One Academy. The training sessions include mental health training, ethics training, cultural diversity training, defensive tactics training, media training, safety and firearms training, crime scene evidence and collection training and investigations.
- Officer James Geddes attended and completed Active Shooter Training on October 17th.

- All Officers will be completing mandatory Firearms Qualifications in December.
- Detective Brian Schaible attended and completed FBI Inter-County Detective School from October 3rd to October 7th.

EQUIPMENT

The Police Department is looking to upgrade some of our aging equipment. These items consist Tasers (5 years old / obsolete models), transferring the Department's data system from an 8-year-old server to the Cloud and upgrading our current reporting system to a web based system. The Department continues to work with the Public Safety Committee, Borough Council and the Borough Manager on determining the budget costs of these items, as well as, the best possible timeframe to replace them.

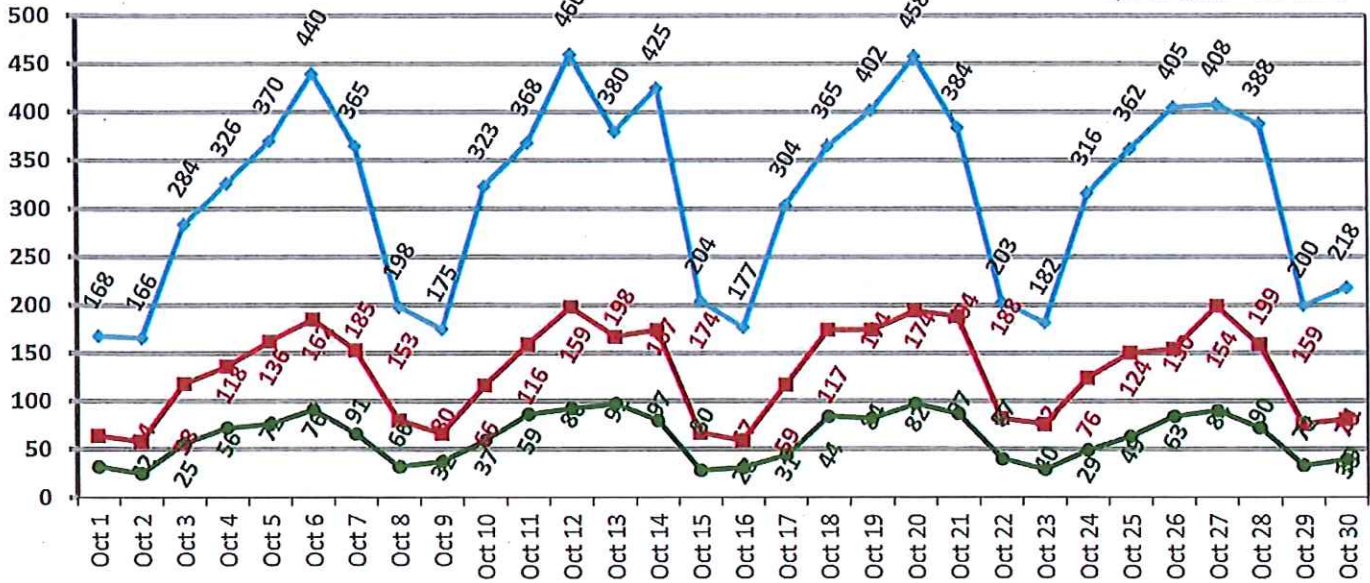

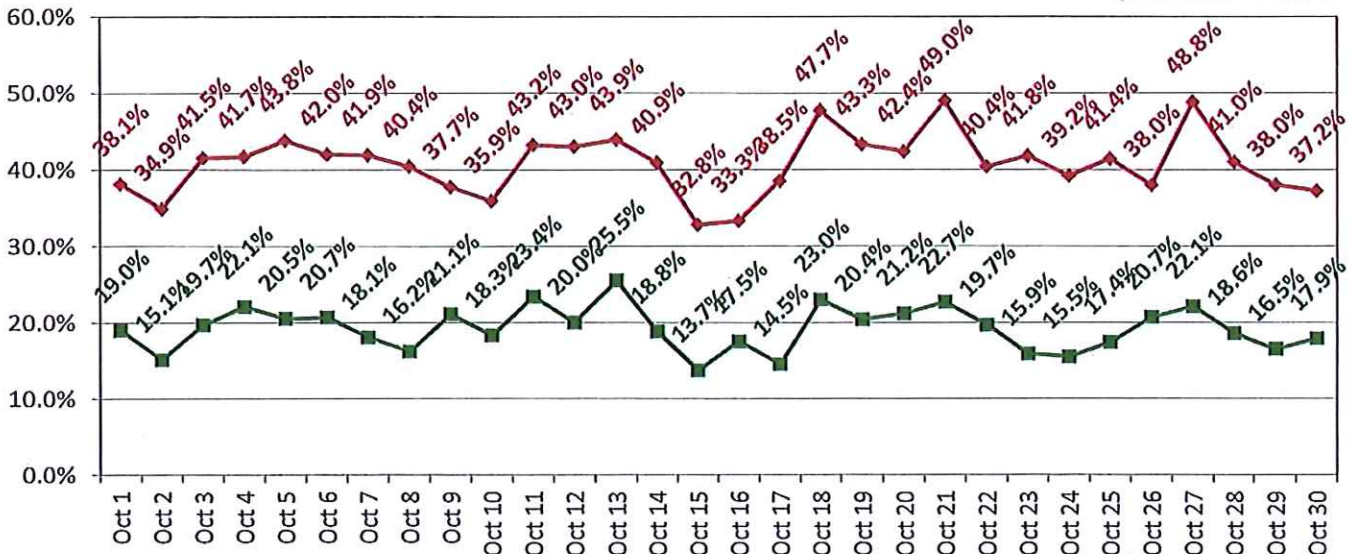

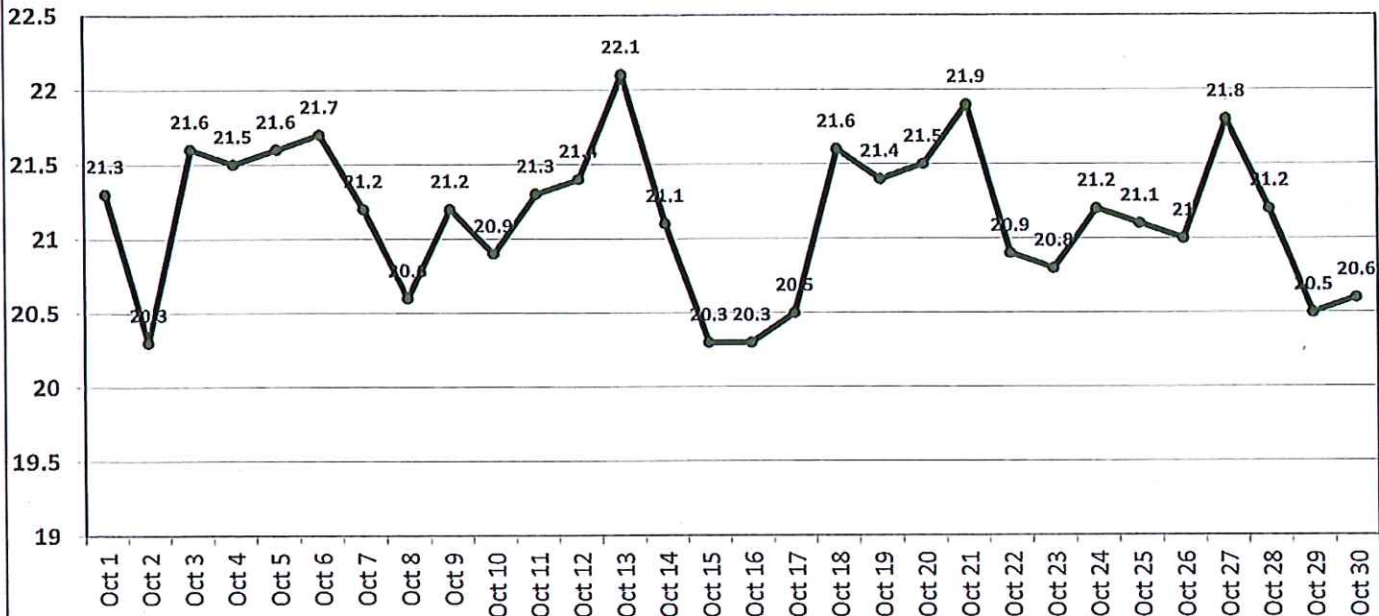

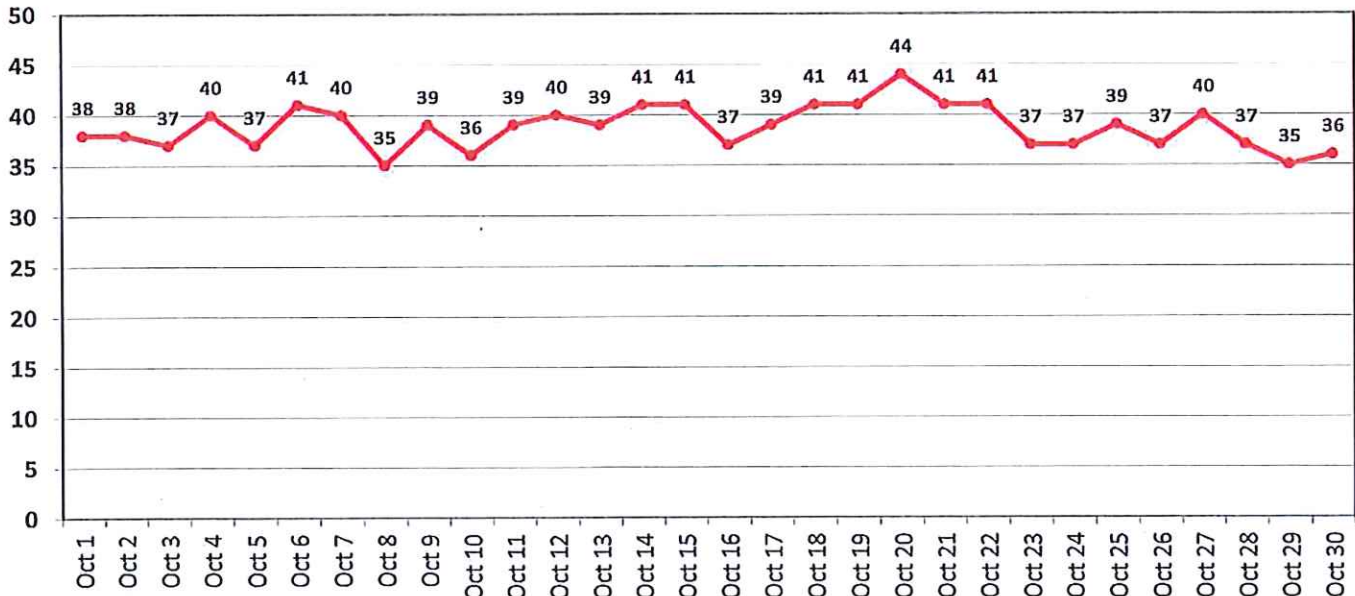

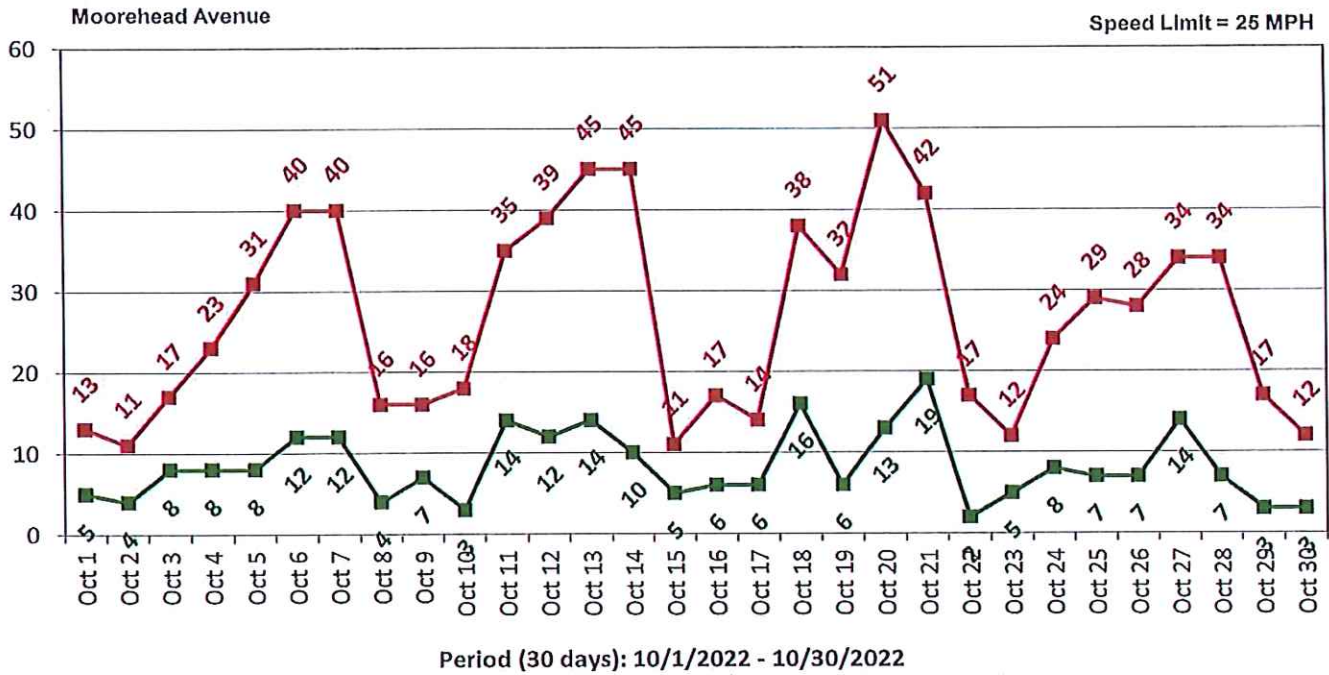

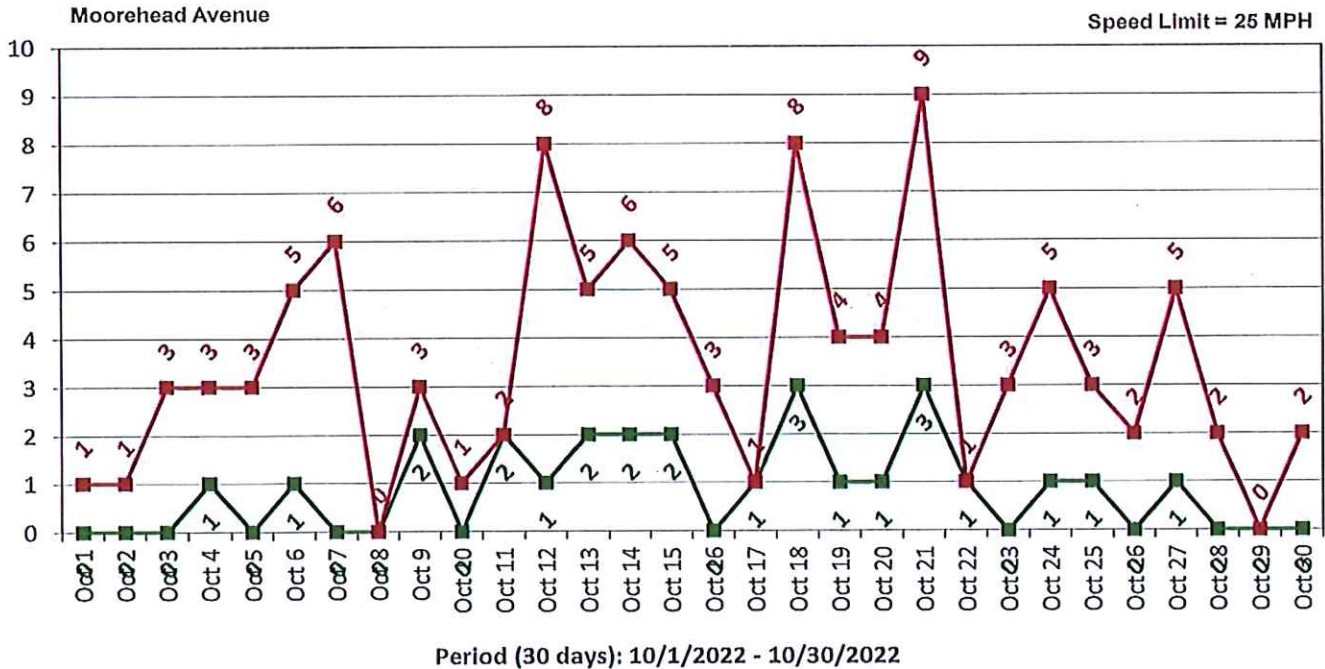

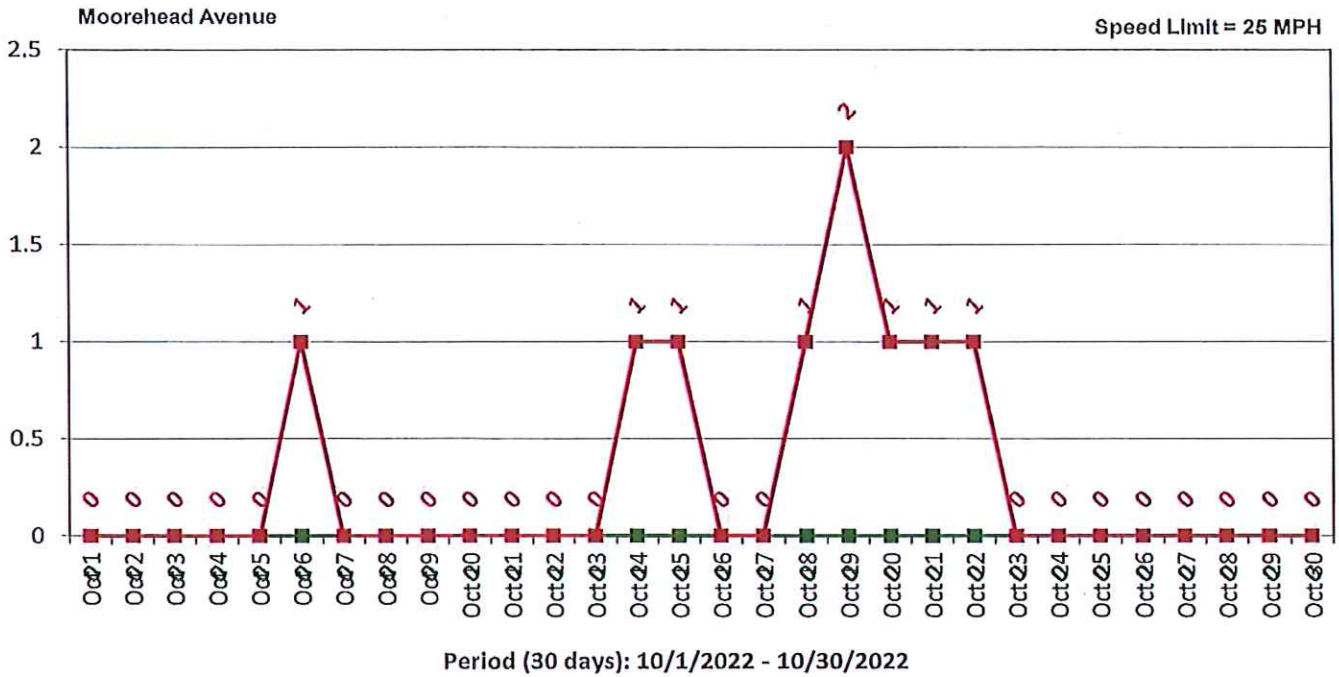

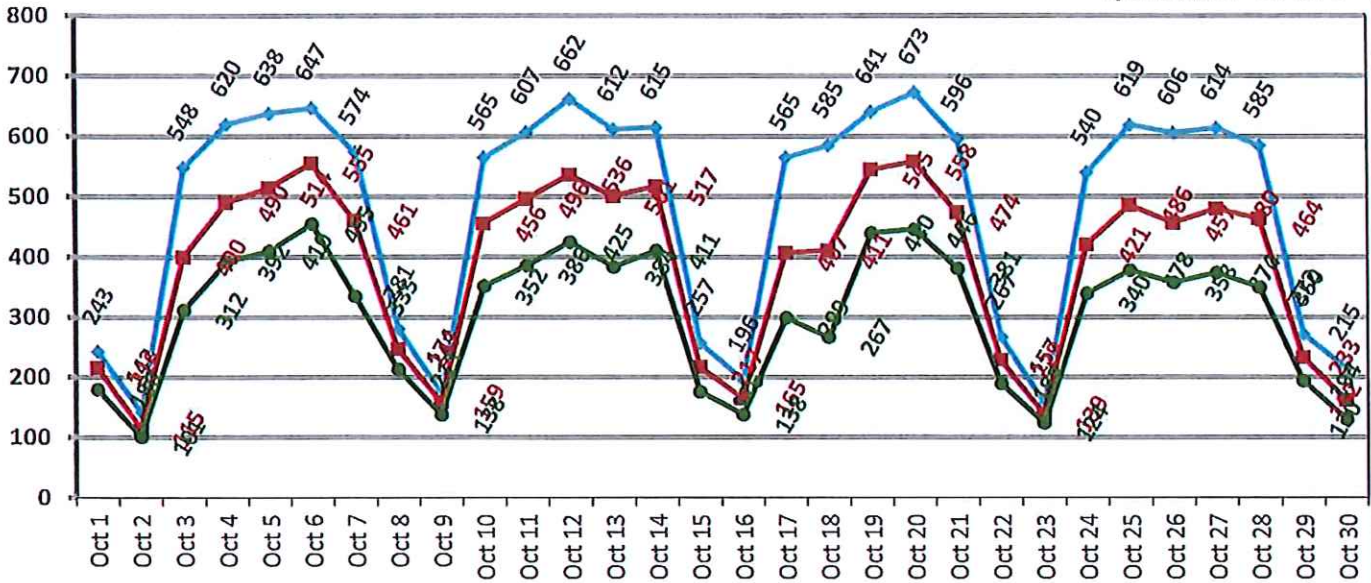

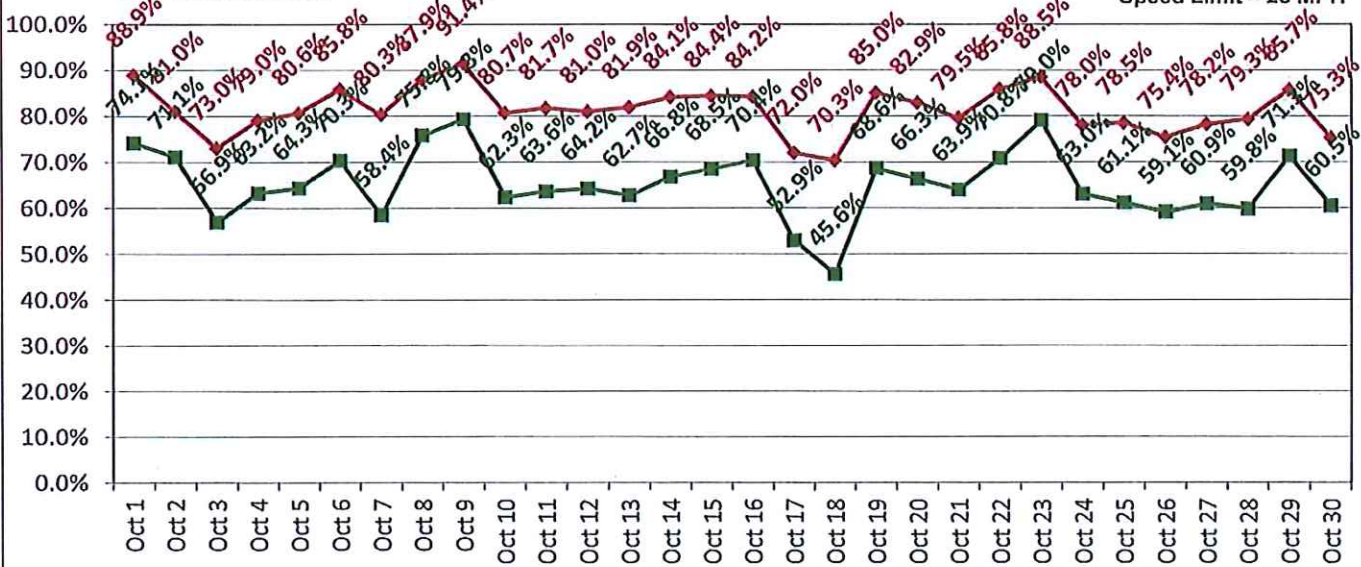

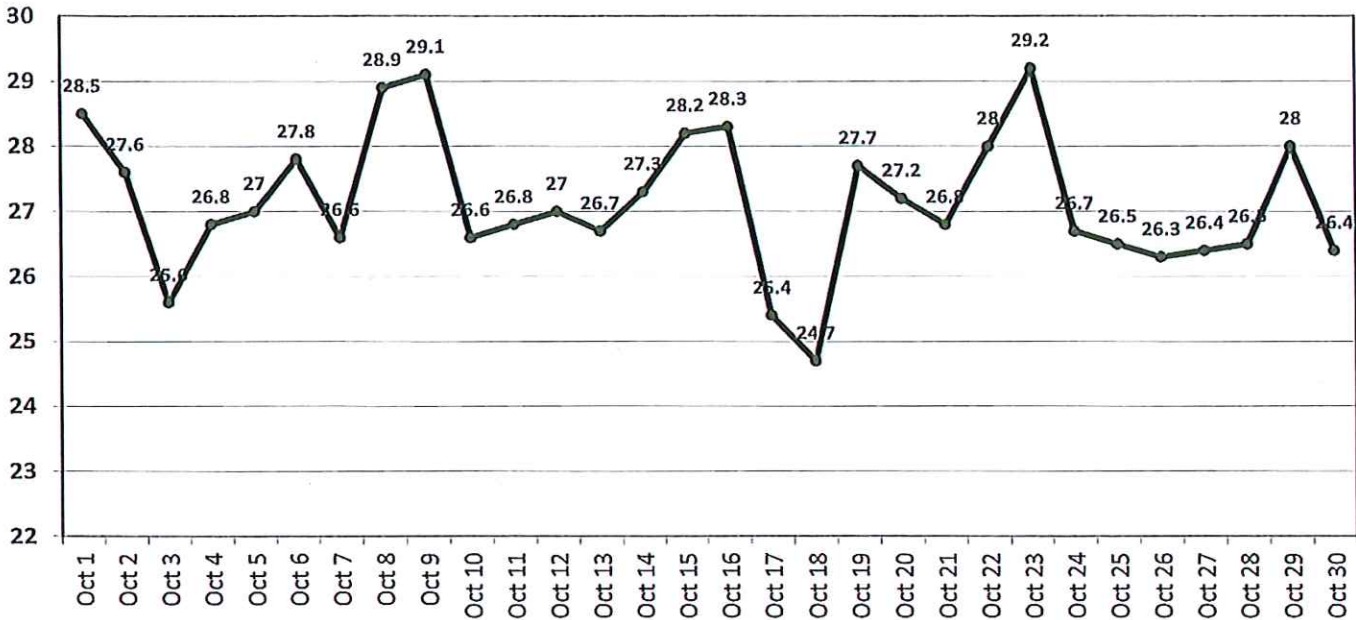

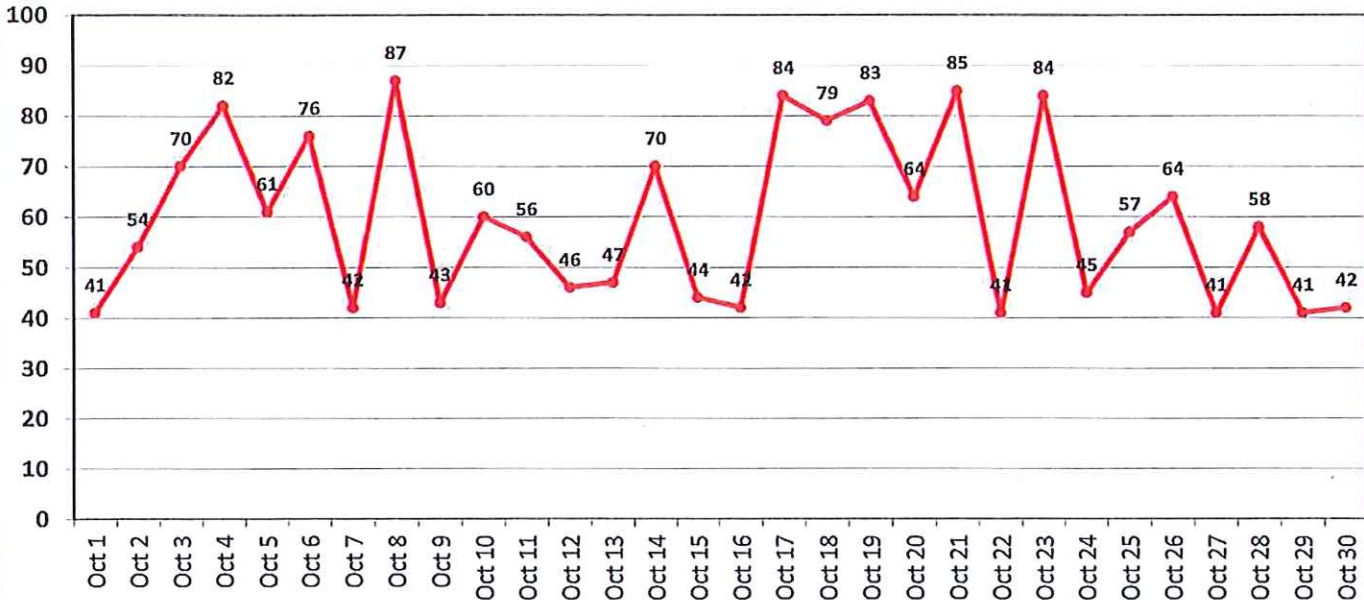

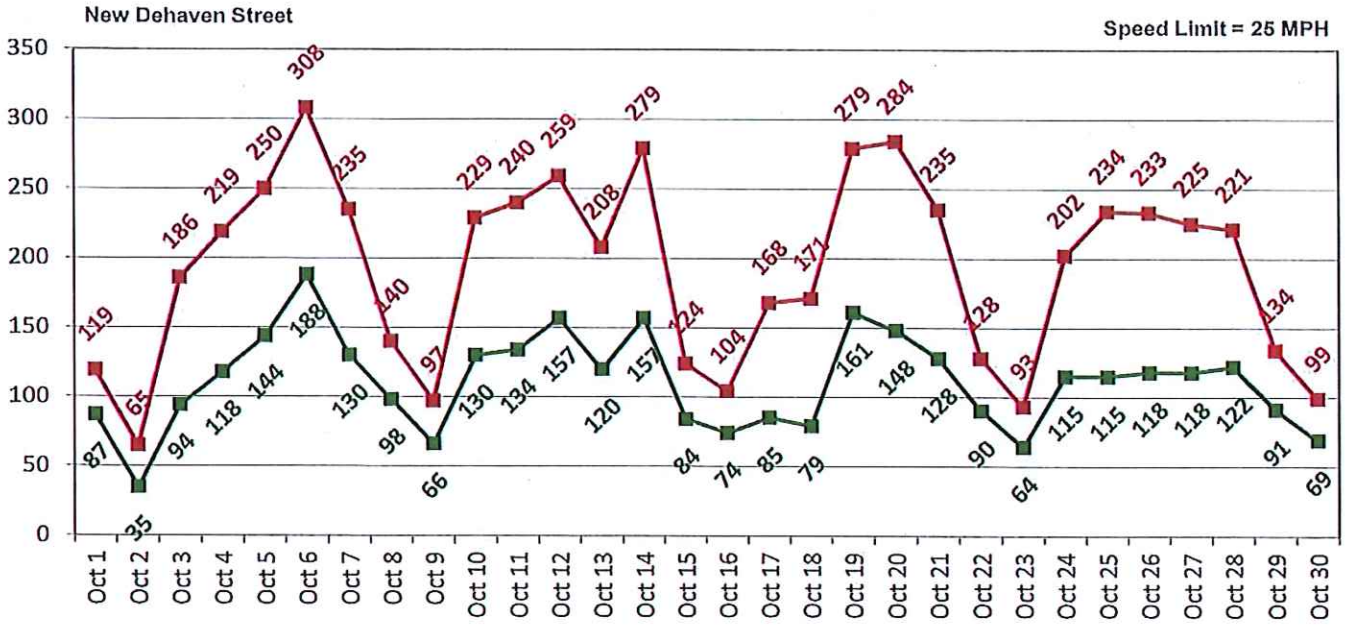

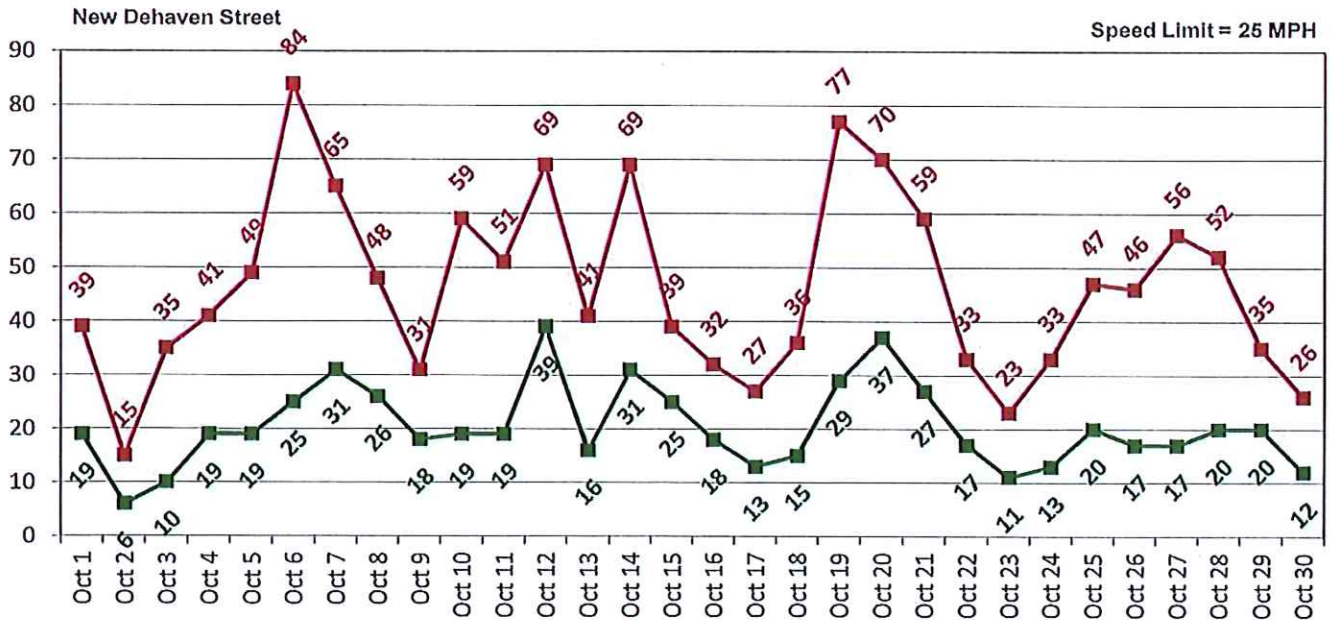

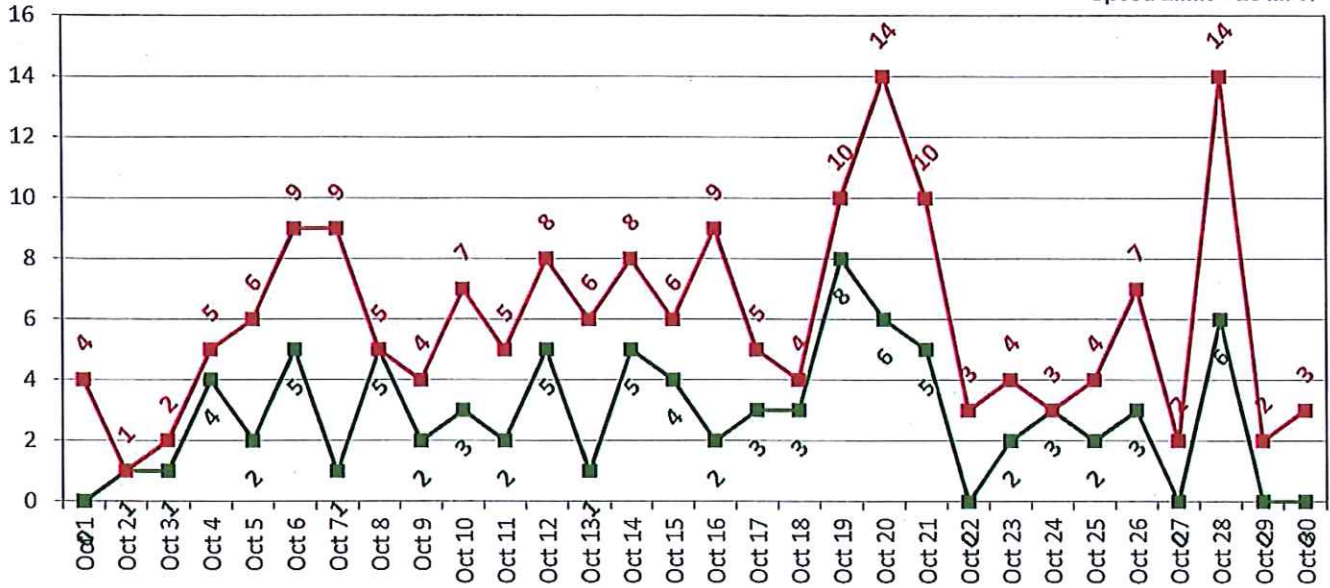

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BY AMENDING CHAPTER 20 ENTITLED "PLANNING COMMISSION" FOR THE PURPOSES OF ADDING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken has met the procedural requirements of 53 P.S. § 10101, *et seq.*, of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code for the adoption of the proposed Ordinance pertaining to the rules and regulations of the Planning Commission of the Borough of West Conshohocken, including holding a public hearing;

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §101, *et seq.*, authorizes the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken to make and adopt ordinances that are consistent with the constitution and the laws of the Commonwealth that it deems necessary for the proper management, care, and control of the Borough and the maintenance of peace, good government, health and welfare of the Borough and its citizens and residents;

WHEREAS, the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken desires to amend Chapter 20 entitled "Planning Commission" of the Code of the Borough of West Conshohocken for the purposes of adding sections related to the rules and regulations thereof;

WHEREAS, the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken after due consideration of the proposed ordinance at a duly advertised public meeting, has determined that the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens and residents of West Conshohocken will be served by this Ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken, and it is hereby **ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the authority of the same:

§ I. RECITALS.

The recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

§ II. AMENDMENT OF THE CODE.

Chapter 20 entitled "Planning Commission" of the Code of the Borough of West Conshohocken is hereby amended to add the following sections:

§ 20-5 Alternate Member.

The Planning Commission may consist of one alternate member who shall serve on the Planning Commission in the event of absence, recusal, disqualification, or any other reason, of a member. The alternate member shall be appointed by resolution of the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken and shall be a resident of the Borough in accordance with the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, 53 P.S. § 10203. The term of office of an alternate member shall be for four years.

§ 20-6 Voting.

- A. Each member shall be entitled to one vote.
- B. If a quorum is present, a simple majority of the votes cast on any particular matter of business will carry the issue.
- C. A motion from the floor must be made and passed in order to table any item on the agenda.
- D. A motion from the floor must be made and passed in order to make a recommended action on any item on the agenda.

§ 20-7 Officers.

- A. The Officers of the Planning Commission shall consist of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- B. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings and hearings of the Planning Commission and shall have the duties normally conferred by parliamentary usage on such officers.
- C. In the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman shall preside at the meetings and hearings of the Planning Commission and shall have the duties normally conferred by parliamentary usage on such officers.

§ 20-8 Election of officers.

- A. An annual organization meeting shall be held during the first regular meeting in January or at a special meeting following the organization meeting of the governing body.
- B. Nomination shall be made from the floor at the annual organization meeting and election of the officers specified in § 20-7(a) shall follow immediately thereafter.
- C. A candidate receiving a majority vote of the entire membership of the Planning Commission shall be declared elected, and shall serve for one year or until his successor shall take office.

D. Vacancies in office shall be filled immediately by regular election procedure.

§ 20-9 Meetings.

- A. Public notice shall be published of all meetings.
- B. Regular meetings will be held on the First Thursday of each month at 7:00 PM at Borough Hall, 112 Ford Street, West Conshohocken, PA. In the event of conflict with holidays or other events, a majority at any meeting may change the date of said meeting.
- C. A quorum shall consist of three members. A quorum is necessary to transact business.
- D. The Municipal Clerk designated by the Borough Manager shall keep the minutes and records of the Commission, and with the assistance of such staff as is available, shall prepare the agenda of regular and special meetings under the direction of the Chairman, provide notice of all meetings to Commission members, arrange proper and legal notice of hearings, attend to correspondence of the Commission, and such other duties as are normally carried out by a Municipal Clerk.
- E. Special meetings may be called by the Chairman. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to call a special meeting when requested to do so by a majority of members of the Commission. The Municipal Clerk shall notify all members of the Commission not less than 24 hours in advance of such special meeting and provide notice to the public as required by the Sunshine Act, Act 94 of 1986, as amended, 67 Pa. C.S. § 701, *et seq.*
- F. All meetings shall be conducted in conformance with the requirements of the Sunshine Act. All meetings shall be open to the general public. Any person attending a meeting shall have the right to use recording devices to record all proceedings. Use of devices such as audio, video, or other recording equipment shall be subject to state rules and regulations.

§ 20-10 Order of business.

The order of business at regular meetings shall be:

- 1. Roll call
- 2. Public comment on agenda items
- 3. Old business
- 4. New business
- 5. General public comment
- 6. Adjournment

§ III. REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, it being understood and intended that all ordinances and the Code of Ordinances for the Borough of West Conshohocken, such as are not otherwise specifically in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect, the same being reaffirmed hereby.

§ IV. REVISIONS.

The Borough of West Conshohocken does hereby reserve the right, from time to time, to adopt modifications of, supplements to, or amendments of its Ordinance, including this provision.

§ V. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provisions shall be separate, distinct and independent, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

§ VI. FAILURE TO ENFORCE NOT A WAIVER

The failure of the Borough to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Borough of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

§ VII. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment.

§ 109-24. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the highways or parts thereof described below except at the angle designated and only within the painted stall lines. On all highways or portions thereof where angle parking is now or shall hereafter be authorized, all vehicles parked thereon shall be parked with the front thereof nearest the curb.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF THE WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH BY ADDING CHAPTER 103 ENTITLED "FIREWORKS" FOR THE PURPOSES OF ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH AND TO AMEND THE BOROUGH'S PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS TO PERMIT FIREWORK DISPLAYS IN SAID PARKS IF ORGANIZED BY THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN.

WHEREAS, the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken has met the procedural requirements of 53 P.S. § 10101, et seq., of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code for the adoption of the proposed Ordinance pertaining to the use of fireworks within West Conshohocken Borough, including holding a public hearing;

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §101, et seq., authorizes the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken to make and adopt ordinances that are consistent with the constitution and the laws of the Commonwealth that it deems necessary for the proper management, care, and control of the Borough and the maintenance of peace, good government, health and welfare of the Borough and its citizens and residents;

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken to protect the health, safety and welfare of the general public through regulation of the use of fireworks. It is the intent of the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken that this chapter will be in accordance with and supplemental to Act 43 of 2017 by the Pennsylvania State Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken, and it is hereby ordained and enacted, by the authority of the same, to wit:

§ I. RECITALS.

The recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

§ II. AMENDMENTS OF THE CODE.

A. A NEW CHAPTER OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN IS HEREBY ADDED AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 103 Fireworks

§ 103-1 Intent.

It is the intent of the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken to protect the health, safety and welfare of the general public through limiting the use of fireworks. It is the intent of the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken that this chapter will be in accordance with and supplemental to Act 43 of 2017 by the Pennsylvania State Legislature.

§ 103-2 Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated:

FIREWORKS

Any combustible or explosive composition or any substance or combination of substances or articles prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or an audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation.

CONSUMER FIREWORKS

Any combustible or explosive composition or any substance or combination of substances intended to produce visible and/or audible effects by combustion and which is suitable for use by the public that complies with the construction, performance, composition and labeling requirements promulgated by the Consumer Products Safety Commission in 16 CFR (relating to commercial practices) or any successor regulation and which complies with the provisions for "consumer fireworks" as defined in the American Pyrotechnics Association (APA) Standard 87-1, including but not limited to Sections *3.1 and *3.5, or any successor standard. The term does not include devices such as "ground and handheld sparkling devices" as defined in APA Standard 87-1, Section *3.1.1, "novelties" as defined in APA Standard 87-1, Section *3.2. or "toy caps" as defined in APA Standard 87-1, Section *3.3.

DISPLAY FIREWORKS

Defined as more fully set forth in 27 CFR 555.11 (meaning of terms), which is incorporated herein by reference which meets the types of display fireworks devices set forth in the APA Standard 87-1, Section *4.1 which comply with requirements for display fireworks set forth in APA Standard 87-1.

§ 103-3 Violations and penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who or which shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 and costs of prosecution.

§ 103-4 Statutory authority.

This chapter is enacted under the authority of the Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania of May 1, 1933, P.L. 1161, as amended by the Act of July 10, 1947, P.L. 1481, and of the Act of the General Assembly of May 15, 1939, as amended by the Act of June 24, 1959, P.L. 486.

§ 103-5 Display fireworks.

The use of display fireworks shall be subject to the following:

A. Permit required; nontransferability; term.

It shall be unlawful for any person, group of persons, fair association, amusement park, municipality or other organization to publicly display or cause to be displayed fireworks without first obtaining a permit for the supervised public display of fireworks from the Borough Fire Marshal, who shall grant or deny such permit in accordance with the regulations hereinafter provided. No permit granted hereunder shall be transferable. Every such permit issued will be valid for the period of seven days following the date of issue, whereafter such permit shall be null and void.

B. Application for permit.

Applications for permits shall be made to the Borough in writing at least 30 days in advance of the date of the display. Applications shall be made available through the Borough Code Enforcement Office.

C. Permit fee.

For every such permit for the supervised public display of fireworks granted under this chapter, there shall be paid to the Borough a fee in the amount set by resolution of the Council for the Borough of West Conshohocken.

D. Bond and insurance.

Any permittee under this chapter shall be required to post a bond in the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) conditioned for the payment of all damages which may be caused either to a person or persons or to property, real or personal, by reason of the permitted display and arising from any acts of the permittee or his agent, employee or subcontractor. In addition, the permittee shall be required to obtain an insurance policy with liability coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and shall be required to add West Conshohocken Borough as an additional insured.

E. Standards and conditions.

No permit for the supervised public display of fireworks shall be granted by the Fire Marshal unless the following regulations have been complied with such that, in the opinion of the Fire Marshal after inspection, the proposed display will not be hazardous to any property within the Borough or endanger any person or persons therein:

- (1) Every such display shall be supervised by a person competent and experienced in the supervision of such public displays of fireworks.
- (2) The actual point at which the fireworks are to be discharged shall be at least 150 feet from the nearest permanent building, public street or railroad or other means of travel and at least 100 feet from the nearest aboveground telephone or telegraph line, tree or overhead obstruction.
- (3) No display fireworks shall be discharged at any point in the Borough within 600 feet of any hospital, asylum or infirmary.
- (4) The audience at any supervised public display of fireworks shall be restrained behind lines at least 100 feet from the point at which the fireworks are to be discharged, and only the person in charge of the display and his assistants are to be allowed within the lines.
- (5) All fireworks that fire projectiles shall be erected in such a manner that the projectiles will go into the air as nearly as possible at an angle of not more than 15° from the vertical and shall be directed away from the position of the spectators.
- (6) Fireworks unfired shall, immediately following the display, be disposed of in any manner safe for those particular types of fireworks.
- (7) The use of display fireworks shall be strictly prohibited within any closed structure or any building or tent.

§ 103-6 Consumer fireworks.

A. Any person purchasing, possessing or using consumer fireworks must be at least 18 years of age. A person may not intentionally ignite or discharge:

- (1) Consumer fireworks on public or private property without the express permission of the owner.
- (2) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices within, or throw from, a motor vehicle or building.
- (3) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices into or at a motor vehicle, building or person.

- (4) Consumer fireworks or sparkling devices while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug.
- (5) No person may ignite or discharge M-80s, M-100s, blockbusters or cherry bombs.
- (6) Consumer fireworks within 150 feet of an occupied or unoccupied structure.
- (7) Consumer fireworks after 10 p.m. with the exception that consumer fireworks may be discharged on the Fourth of July until 11 p.m. and New Year's Eve fireworks may be discharged until 12:30 a.m. on New Year's Day.
- (8) No person may ignite or discharge consumer fireworks more than one day per week.
- (9) No property may be utilized to ignite or discharge consumer fireworks more than one day per week.
- (10) The use of consumer fireworks shall be strictly prohibited within any closed structure or any building or tent.

B. CHAPTER 72 EXHIBIT A ENTITLED "MACKENZIE PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS" §B(13) IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

The sentence "Fireworks and explosives are not permitted" shall be replaced with the following sentence:

"Fireworks and explosives are not permitted in Mackenzie Park, with the exception of firework displays or events organized by the Borough."

C. CHAPTER 72 EXHIBIT B ENTITLED "ST. GERT'S PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS" IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

The sentence "Fireworks and explosives are not permitted" shall be replaced with the following sentence:

"Fireworks and explosives are not permitted in St. Gert's Park, with the exception of firework displays or events organized by the Borough."

D. CHAPTER 72 IS HEREBY AMENDED TO ADD ARTICLE IV ENTITLED "BOROUGH OPEN SPACE PARK LOCATED BETWEEN EIZABETH STREET AND NATHAN'S PLACE" TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Article IV. Borough Open Space Park Located Between Elizabeth Street and Nathan's Place.

§ 72-7 Fireworks Prohibition.

Fireworks and explosives are not permitted in the Borough Open Space Park located between Elizabeth Street and Nathan's Place, with the exception of firework displays or events organized by the Borough.

§ III. REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, it being understood and intended that all ordinances and the Code of Ordinances for the Borough of West Conshohocken, such as are not otherwise specifically in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect, the same being reaffirmed hereby.

§ IV. REVISIONS.

The Borough of West Conshohocken does hereby reserve the right, from time to time, to adopt modifications of, supplements to, or amendments of its Ordinance, including this provision.

§ V. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provisions shall be separate, distinct and independent, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

§ VI. FAILURE TO ENFORCE NOT A WAIVER.

The failure of the Borough to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Borough of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

§ VII. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment.
