West Conshohocken Borough Hometown Heroes Banners

The West Conshohocken Borough Hometown Heroes Banner Program is a living tribute created for the community to recognize and honor our West Conshohocken Borough Veterans who are serving or are veterans who have served our country in the United States Armed Forces.

To qualify, a Veteran, living or deceased, must have had a connection to the West Conshohocken Borough (attended local schools, relative, friend, etc...) at some point in his or her life, also those honored on West Conshohocken Borough War Memorials and Veterans recommended by the local VFW and American Legion Posts.



The Banner will be 24" x 48", 18oz., heavy vinyl, printed the same on both sides, and will display the service person's photograph, include their full name, branch of the Military and the era of service (WWI, WWII, Vietnam, etc.) Banners will be displayed from May through Veterans Day in November in observance of all Military Branch birthdays. Banners will be removed and stored until the same period in the following year at which time they will be redisplayed.

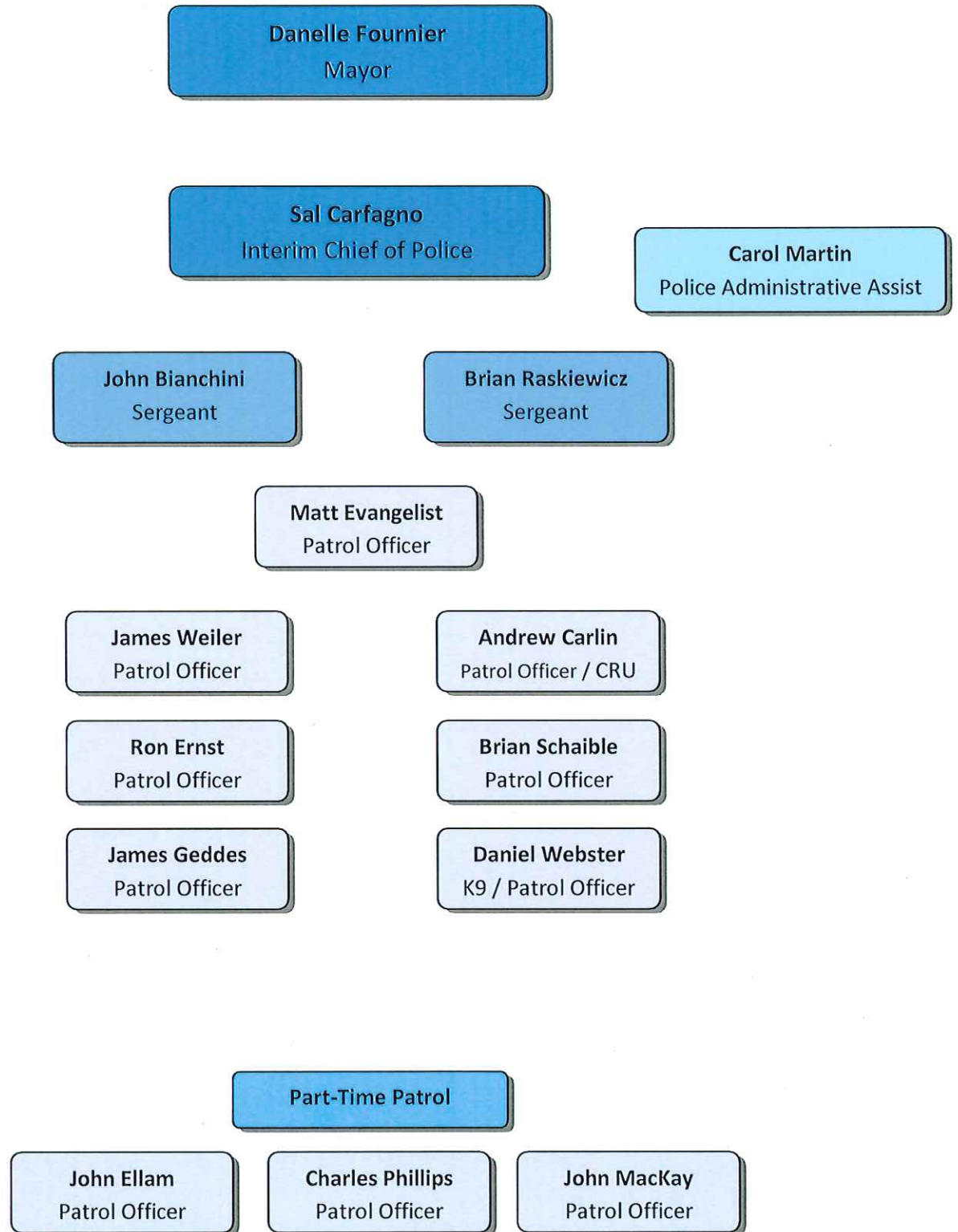

DAILY OPERATIONS

Investigations

The Police Department has instituted a new investigations team consisting of Squad Investigators. This Unit will be able to cover all investigations around the clock and insure that all the unit's investigators have opportunities to investigate crimes and handle crime scenes regularly. This will also allow the Department personnel to train and become better acclimated with handling criminal incidents in the future.

Training

- The Police Department has completed the purchase of new firearms with optics to replace the old firearms. All of the Department's Officer will be completing mandatory Municipal Police Officers' Training Qualifications with the new firearms in February.
- The Department's Officers have already begun their mandatory Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training (MPOETC) updates for the upcoming 2023 year.
- Officer James Geddes complete training on Child Physical Abuse Investigations & Collaborations with Medical Professionals. The training consisted of first-hand experience and real-life examples shared by medical teams from Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) along with child protection and law enforcement professionals. Expert co-presenters outlined investigative considerations for effective multidisciplinary investigative team response to child physical abuse allegations.
- All of the Police Department's Officers continue to participate in daily online training sessions through Police One Academy. These training sessions are updated regularly and provide instruction on every aspect of modern day Policing.
- The Police Department's Officers will begin reeducating themselves on the Police Departments new Policies and Procedures manual. This will consist of regular testing to provide Officers with a better understanding and recognition of the Department's Policies and Procedures.
- Multiple Officers are scheduled to attend in crime scene processing and evidence collection training in March.

- All of Department Officers will complete Overdose Information Network (ODIN) training sessions administered by the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP). Officers will be responsible for entering overdose occurrences as mandated by Act 158.

Effective 01/02/2023, the Overdose Mapping Act (Act 158 of 2022) became Pennsylvania law and directs the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) to launch and maintain an overdose information network for the purpose of electronically tracking known or suspected drug overdoses occurring within the Commonwealth. The PSP has managed the Overdose Information Network (ODIN). PSP will continue to utilize this platform in adherence with Act 158 of 2022, which directs all Pennsylvania law enforcement officers to create an ODIN database entry record of a known or suspected drug overdose occurrence.

- The Police Department has instituted annual employee evaluations that will provide Officers with an Employee Development Program. This program will be conducted annual for all the Department's Officers.

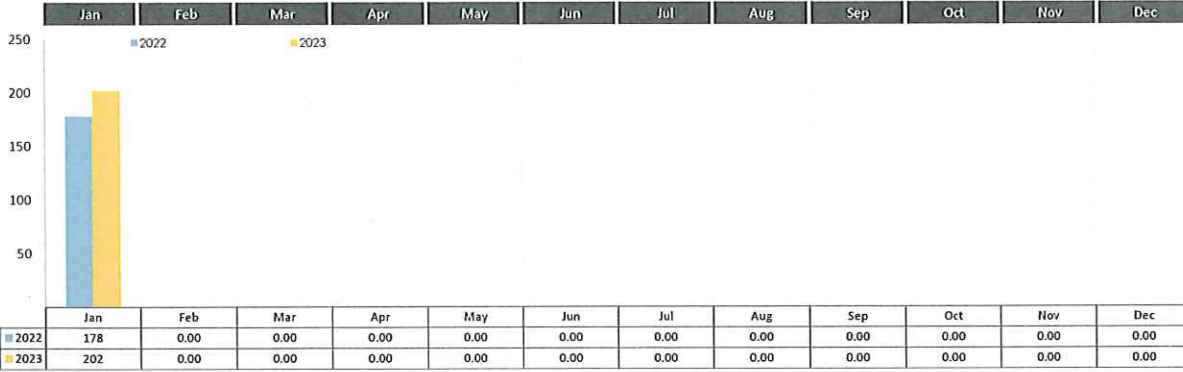

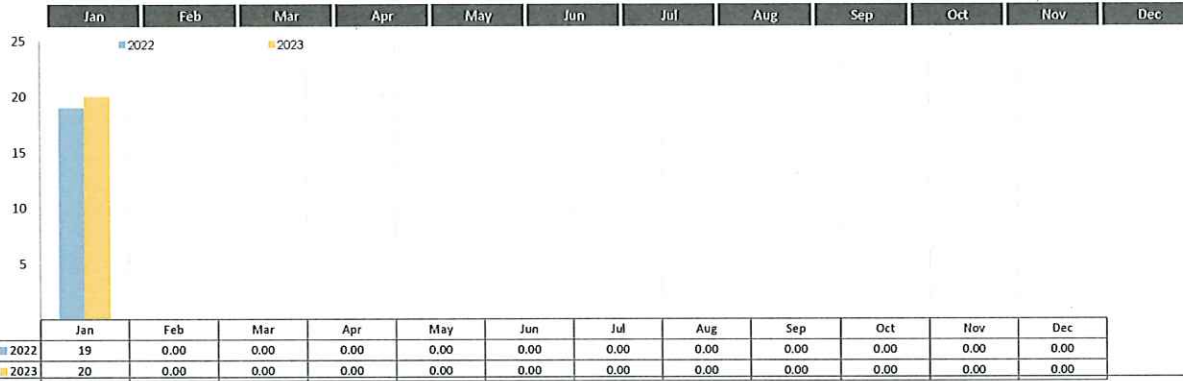

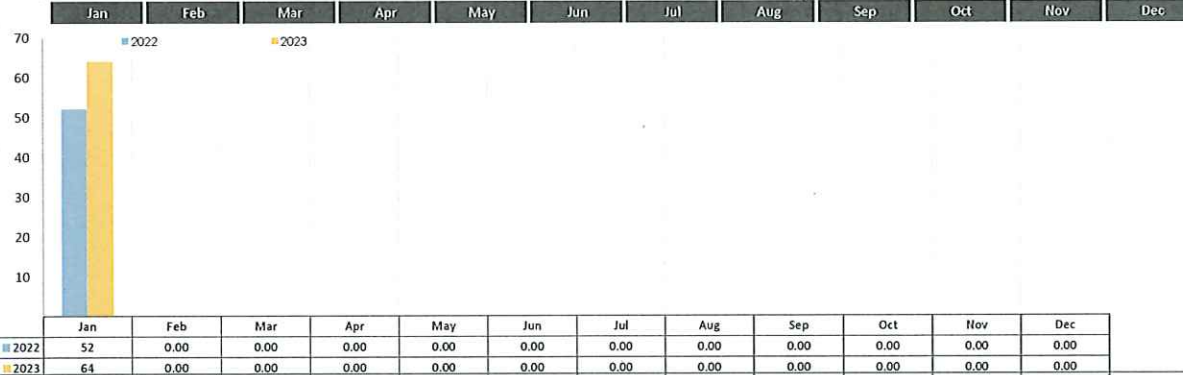
