### George Clay Fire Department Celebrates 125 Years



On June 22, 1898, forty-seven citizens of the Borough of West Conshohocken met in Odd Fellows Hall for the purpose of taking preliminary steps to organize a fire company. A fire at Davis Lumber Yard, current site of the office towers along the river, just a few years earlier prompted their action. Prior to 1898 the closest fire departments available to respond were coming from Conshohocken or Norristown. The firehouse and our town have a history that is intertwined and to try to summarize 125 years here is impossible. Here are just two moments that exemplify the tight connection.

In 1903 a fire at the public school in town was discovered by patrolling West Conshohocken Police Officer James McShane. After three hours George Clay Fire Department along with Washie's had the fire under control. Unfortunately, the damage displaced our students, and until repairs could be made the firehouse was set up as the temporary school.

One of the worst incidents in West Conshohocken was the horrific gas explosion fire on Front Street in January 1971 where some lost their lives, and several lost their homes and all their possessions. The volunteers worked tirelessly in freezing temperatures to control the flames and save as many lives and homes as they could. The damage was devastating and the firehall was used as a home base to serve food and collect clothing or other items for the residents who had lost so much.

125 years and still serving the community, the volunteers of George Clay dedicate countless hours of their personal time training to be ready to help at a moment's notice. Apart from their emergency services, the firehouse continues to be a center point of activity for our community. The Volunteers and Auxiliary members host holiday events, blood drives, and community education outreach about CPR and fire prevention. ## Recycling in West Conshohocken Borough

Recycling is an essential part of our civic responsibility, and it feels good to reduce our waste! Here are some tips to remember so that your recyclable items get a second life and what belongs in the trash does not go into the recycling bin.

Click HERE for a full list.

- Accepted items: clean paper, cardboard, plastic, and glass containers – #1-7, cartons (food & beverage), and clean flexible plastic film (e.g., cereal box liners, store bags, toilet paper & water case over wrap)
- Put recyclables in LOOSE and clean into your bin, not in a plastic bag. The machines can handle small sizes of plastic film but NOT garbage size bags.



Contamination is putting things that do not belong into the recycling. This makes recycling less valuable and more expensive to process. These are a few items that do NOT belong in the bin. Click <u>HERE</u> for a full list.

- Do NOT recycle: Rechargeable batteries of ANY kind (e.g, toothbrushes, wireless headphones, or batteries from cell phones & power tools). These are a <u>serious</u> fire hazard and should be taken to a store drop-off site such as Best Buy, Lowe's, or Home Depot.
- Also NOT RECYCLABLE: Hoses, string lights, heavy metal objects, metal hangers, yard waste, diapers, window glass, Styrofoam (despite its #6 triangle), food.



In West Conshohocken, our recycling provider, JP Mascaro & Sons, has excellent information on how to recycle to make the most impact in reducing waste. Thank you also, to our West Conshohocken Borough Public Works for providing excellent services for waste removal. Consider doing what you can as a resident to reduce the waste you create and recycle right!

- The Police Department continues updating and finalize the Department's new Policy and Procedures Manual. Thanks to The Aspirant Consulting Group for all of their hard work implementing all of the new updated policies.

## **Training**

- All of the Department's Officers completing Firearms Qualifications and Patrol Rifle in June.
- All of the Department's Officers continue to complete their mandatory Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training (MPOETC) update courses for 2023.
- All of the Police Department's Officers participate in a minimum of four (4) online training sessions per month through Police One Academy. These training sessions provide up to date instruction on every aspect of Policing.
- Some of the upcoming training that Officers are scheduled to attend through the rest of the year are additional Firearms Instruction Training, Crime Scene & Evidence Collection and various Investigation courses.

## **Traffic**

The Police Department continues monitoring all of the Borough's traffic areas and any requests by residents for problem traffic areas. Every day of the week, Officers conducted multiple daily details throughout the Borough. All residents and businesses are encouraged to contact the Police Department to report any traffic complaints or concerns to address them immediately.

## **Parking**

The Police Department would like to inform the Public that the Borough's Merion Avenue Permit Parking Lot "Pilot Program" has officially concluded. New Registrations for residents and business owners interested in applying for Permit Parking at the Merion Avenue Parking Lot can do so at the West Conshohocken Police Department. The applicant must be a resident or business owner, must provide proof of residence or business ownership in the form of a photo identification card and a utility bill. Permits are limited to one per resident or business and one vehicle per resident or business. A \$25.00 registration fee is required each year to obtain a permit. Residents will receive instructions on how to renew their current parking permits as soon as the Borough completes the final documents.

Officers continue to monitor and enforce all parking complaints, issues and concerns throughout the Borough. Residents and businesses are encouraged to contact the Police Department to report any parking complaints or concerns to address them immediately.







# ORDINANCE NO. 2023-03 WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 109 "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC", ARTICLE X "PERMIT PARKING", SECTION 109-72 "PERMIT PARKING APPLICATION AND PROCESS", PARAGRAPH F OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN TO REMOVE THE REFERENCE TO THE EXPIRED 2021 PILOT PERMIT PARKING PROGRAM FOR THE MERION AVENUE PARKING LOT.

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §1202(31), authorizes the Borough Council to regulate the use of parking lots and to regulate parking and provide parking accommodations to promote the convenience and protection of the public;

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §1203, authorizes the Borough Council to make and adopt all ordinances, bylaws, rules and regulations not inconsistent with or restrained by the Constitution of Pennsylvania and laws of this Commonwealth as may be expedient or necessary for the proper management, care and control of the Borough and its finances and the maintenance of peace, good government, safety and welfare of the Borough and its trade, commerce and manufactures;

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 109 of the Code of the Borough of West Conshohocken authorizes the Borough Council to establish parking regulations by ordinance;

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council designated the Merion Avenue Parking Lot as a permit parking zone within the Borough, with associated regulations and fees, by ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council established the 2021 year to be a pilot program, and charged no fees to Borough residents for a parking permit for the Merion Avenue Parking Lot;

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council desires to remove the reference to the expired 2021 pilot permit parking program for the Merion Avenue Parking Lot;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council, after due consideration of the proposed ordinance at a duly advertised public meeting, has determined that the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens and residents of the Borough will be served by this ordinance.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, to wit:

#### §I. RECITALS.

The recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

#### §II. AMENDMENT OF THE CODE.

Chapter 109 "Vehicles and Traffic", Article X "Permit Parking", Section 109-72 "Permit parking application and process", Paragraph F is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### § 109-72 Permit parking application and process.

F. The Borough will charge \$25.00 for a parking permit. All parking permit fees are non-refundable.

#### §III. REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, it being understood and intended that all ordinances and the Code of Ordinances for the Borough of West Conshohocken, such as are not otherwise specifically in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect, the same being reaffirmed hereby.

#### §IV. <u>REVISIONS</u>.

The Borough Council does hereby reserve the right, from time to time, to adopt modifications of, supplements to, or amendments of its ordinances, including this provision.

#### §V. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provisions shall be separate, distinct and independent, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

#### **§VI.** FAILURE TO ENFORCE NOT A WAIVER.

The failure of the Borough to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Borough of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

#### **§VII. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment.

#### **§VIII. ENACTMENT.**

Under the authority conferred by the Borough Code and other relevant statutory law, the Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken in the County of Montgomery, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania does hereby enact and ordain this Ordinance to the Code of Ordinances for the Borough of West Conshohocken this 11th day of July, 2023.
