PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

Mr. English indicated that his report is in the packet. Mr. English touched briefly on the 2023 MMO required to certify for the following year which was recommended by the Borough Actuary Joe Duda. Mr. Ewing indicated that he believed that Mr. Duda answered Ms. Gorney and Mr. Nelson's questions. Mr. Duda indicated that the smoothing model and going by the 6.75 % or 6.5% rate and reduce that rate to 6.25 over time. The state will assist with State Aid. The highest recommendation would be 6.5% with smoothing. Discussions took place between council on the best model. Mr. Blumenthal asked for a motion to approve the MMO at 6.5% with 3 year smoothing.

Mr. Broseman, applicant's attorney, was present at the Council meeting and spoke further about the project. Michael Yanoff, representing a Lower Merion township resident was also present to dispute this settlement agreement. Councilmember Conicello-Emery asked for the exact proposal which John Iannozzi clarified. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that this is only from a five lot up to three lots. Mr. Iannozzi indicated this motion is to accept the Settlement Stipulation.

The rate is 5.56% in 90 day; 5.76% in 180 day and 5.84% in 270 day. The recommendation is to move this into thirds and Mr. Blumenthal asked for a motion.

Dave Frankenfield, resident, asked about fire company finances when other accounts were closed out and put in the general fund and indicated that it should be more. Mr. Ewing indicated that all the money has not been brought over yet.

Walter Gleba, resident, thanked everyone for the 9/11 memorial services. Mr. Gleba in addressed the stop sign at Merion Hill and Spruce Lane. Mr. Gleba provided information to Council regarding accidents, traffic concerns calls. Mr. Gleba is yielding the remaining of his time to the residents whom he brought to speak from Merion Hill

Gene Gryga, resident, had concerns regarding the stop sign and trees overgrowth. Mr. English addressed this individuals concerns and notified him that PennDOT is shorthanded. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that he would also reach out to State Rep for additional resources.

Ed McLaughlin, resident of Merion Hill was also concerned about the stop sign and the overgrowth of trees. Mr. McClaughin commented about the website and provided input.

Tina Reese, resident spoke about the Fire Convention being held in Harrisburg in October. Ms. Reese also made comments about the website.

Jessing Wong, resident of Moorehead Ave, asked to propose an amendment of Section 36.16 - keeping of pigs. Ms. Wong indicates that she owns a pig who is currently in the process of being rehomed. Mr. Blumenthal addressed that the Borough will consider this request.

Guy Davis, resident, spoke about the Planning Commission reports needed at a certain time, and ask for an exception to their report. Mr. Davis also commented about amending the code for invasive species for bamboo overgrowth. Mr. Davis also made suggestions regarding website.

Dave Frankenfield, resident, spoke about the 9/11 memorial, Fire Convention coming up in Harrisburg, the 5K run, and the Fire Company Safety Event and the Fire Company is always looking for volunteer firefighters. Mr. Frankenfield thanked Kelly and Mike Snizavich for their services to the Borough and Fire Company

Mr. Blumenthal thanked everyone for their comments this evening. He encourages everyone to reach out to Dr. Borgerson with any suggestions or comments regarding the website. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that the open Council seat advertisement will be posted within three days and will be appointed by next meeting. There is also an open seat for the Zoning Hearing Board.

COMMITTEE REPORT: Fire Marshall's Report:

The Borough received follow-up from ProSports Motors to address the retaining wall repair, and the owner asked to delay the court hearing because they found information stating it's PennDOT's property. If true, the Borough will also take steps to ensure that his team is no longer able to park in that area. PennDOT is going to work on the wall repair and will force him to stop parking on their property.

Traffic Engineer's Report:

- Surface treatment was completed on Front Street, but they are still able to make adjustments and fix anything if needed. The traffic signals on Front Street and Matsonford were all surveyed and are working as they should be, although Crawford tends to be longer during pedestrian crossings and can short change the next green light. PennDot will be coming out for Park n Ride cleanup soon.
- For the stop sign request on Merion Hill, the criteria to necessitate a 4 way stop with PennDot has not been met. We can request a survey for a few hours but would still likely not qualify. If we were to place a stop sign there without PennDot approval, we could potentially lose out on monetary credits from the state.

Police:

- There were 160 applicants through the Montgomery County Consortium, 25 no-shows to the test, and overall 55 applicants for West Conshohocken. The written test is complete and the agility test will be administered on October 14. From there we can start the rest of the interview process for qualified applicants.

Fire Department:

- They are worried about the timing of the apparatus discussion - if we are or aren't going to replace it we need to make the decision quickly as we are behind in the timeline. The Quint will also need to be replaced soon.
- They have been putting all data into ESO so it's easier to access. The current monthly invoice is higher than usual because payment is tiered based on the number of system users (we are paying for 60 active users). The department is working on putting all physical assets into the system, and this will facilitate aid and collaboration between different fire departments as it creates higher visibility through the system.
- There is a conference that we're looking to send two people to next spring, which was included in the 2024 budget, but if we are able to approve them signing up before October 31 they would be able to save \$300/person.
- The gas plant wants to have a walkthrough for the fire department as well as interested members of council on December 6 at 11AM. Any interested parties should let Mike E or Dennis F know. They are now handling liquified gas and want to prepare for a spill.

Public Comments:

- Walter Gleba wanted to clarify that the stop sign coming down Merion Hill is back way too far before Spruce Street and you are unable to see oncoming traffic. Instead of getting a whole new one, is it possible to move that one forward at all?
- Members of the fire department mentioned that there was an accident up Merion Hill where a truck took out utility poles. There is currently a sign that says "No Trucks" at Moorehead, but is it possible to define that further with a weight limit?
- Does the Borough have any restrictions on AirBnB type rentals? Some residents have been complaining about short term rentals and them not following our parking regulations; is there any recourse here?

Register to Vote

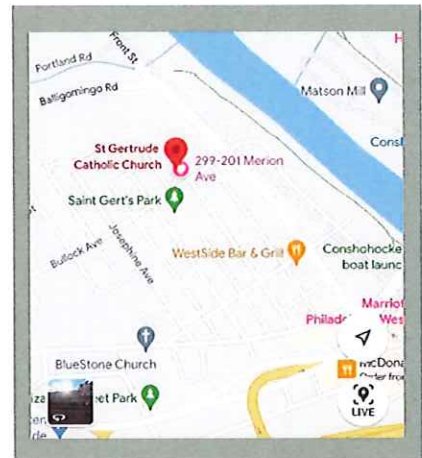
Voters will need to apply again in 2023 to receive a mail ballot for the Primary or General Elections even if they have previously voted by mail ballot.

If you are not registered to vote at your current address, please take the time to do so now.

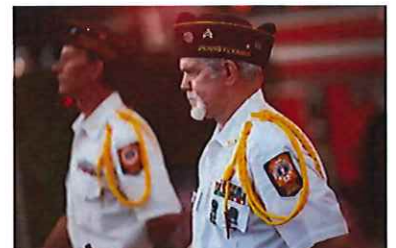

Winners of the "Ride to School in a Police Car" from National Night Out

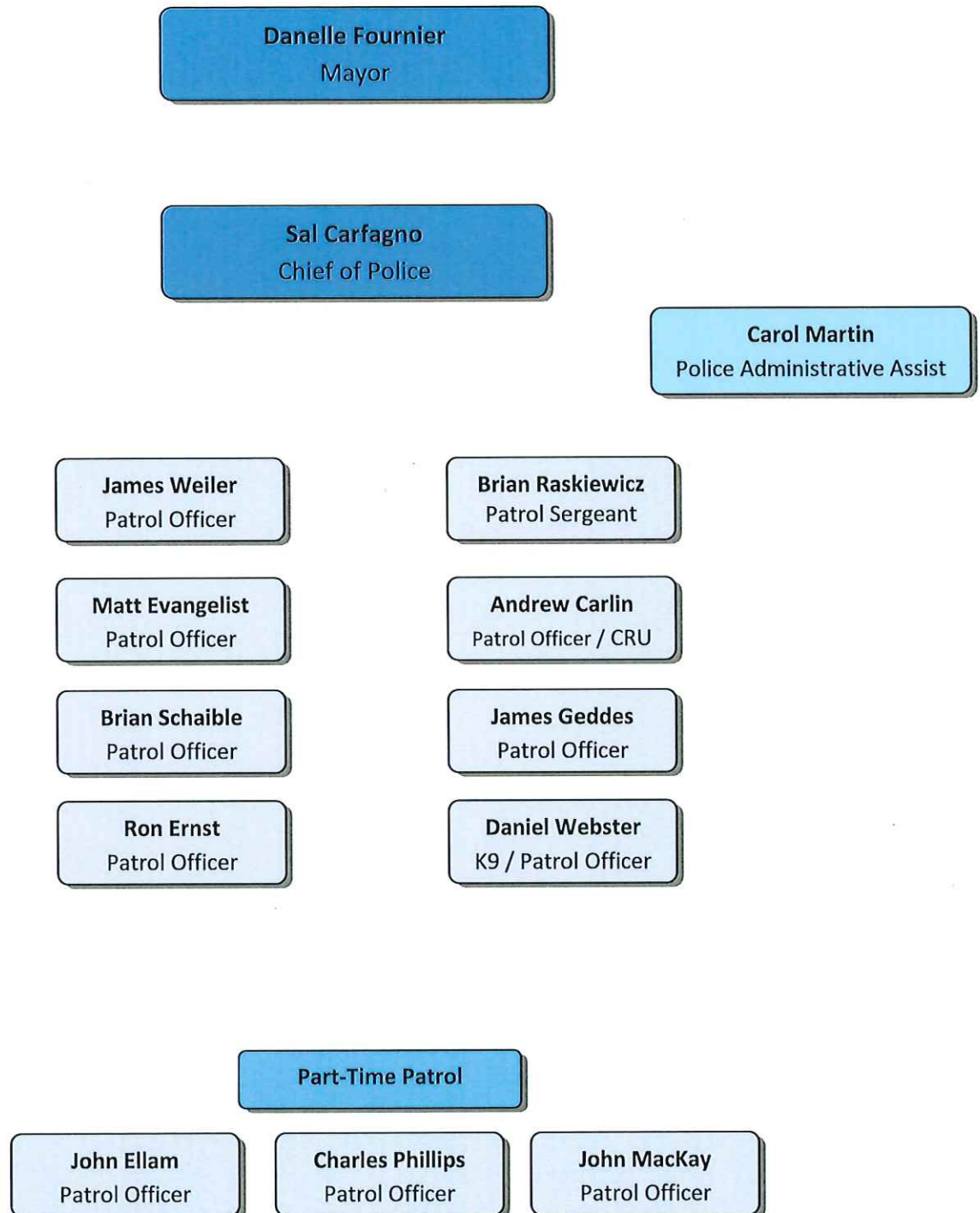


West Conshohocken 9/11 Memorial Service

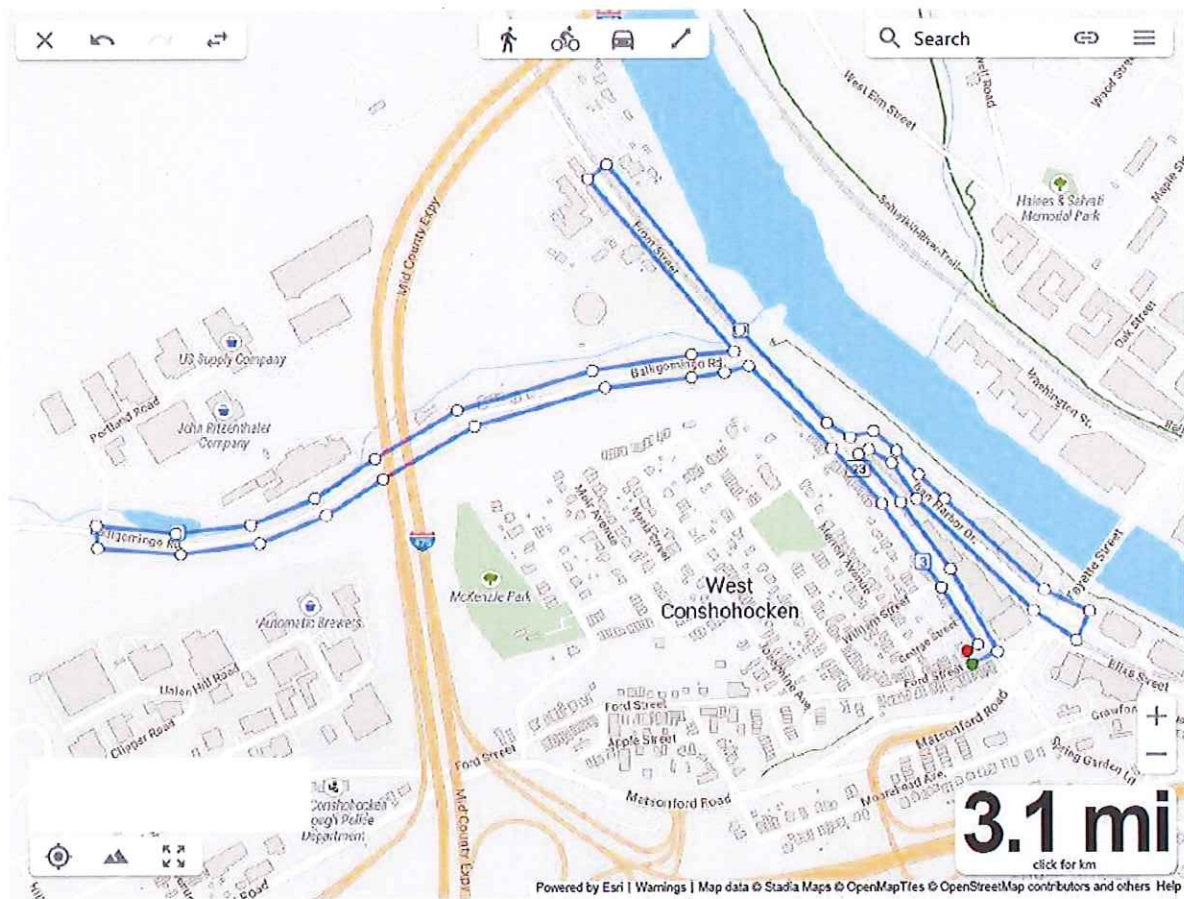

DAILY OPERATIONS

Policies & Procedures

- The Police Department continues updating and finalizing the Department's new Policy and Procedures Manual. Thanks to the Aspirant Consulting Group for all of their hard work writing and updating our new policies. Officers have begun reviewing the Policy and will undergo training on each one as they are implemented.

Training

- All of the Department's Officers continue to complete their mandatory Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training (MPOETC) update courses for 2023.

- All of the Police Department's Officers participate in multiple online training sessions every month through PoliceOne Academy. These training sessions provide up to date instruction on every aspect of Policing.

- Some of the upcoming training that Officers are scheduled to attend through the rest of the year are additional Firearms Instruction Training, Crime Scene & Evidence Collection, Supervisor Training, Defensive Tactics and various Investigation courses.

2024 Police Department Budget

- The Police Department is currently working on the 2024 Budget.

FLEET MANAGEMENT

Police Vehicles

All Police vehicle maintenance records are maintained by the Department's Fleet Management Officers. These records are updated and stored under the Department's online web based Fleet Management / GPS System. This program tracks vehicle maintenance, vehicle service along with vehicle usage and electronically alerts Officers by email and text of upcoming scheduled maintenance.

TRAFFIC & PARKING

Traffic

The Police Department continues monitoring all of the Borough's traffic areas and any requests by residents for problem traffic areas. Every day of the week, Officers conduct multiple daily traffic details throughout the Borough. All residents and businesses are encouraged to contact the Police Department to report any traffic complaints or concerns so that they may be addressed immediately.

The Police Department would like to address the increase in monthly traffic statistics. This increase is due to aggressive traffic enforcement. The Police Department takes every complaint it receives seriously and uses all its resources to address those complaints. Officers conduct traffic enforcement

details four times a day at various areas throughout the Borough. Along, with more vehicles on the roadway than the previous two years and traffic details, this enforcement has led to increased statistics in details and vehicle stops.

Permit Parking

Current permit parking members and any new members must fill out a 2023 Permit Parking application to receive a new permit parking tag for the remainder of this year. **All current permit parking tags will expire on October 1, 2023. Current permit parking tags will be honored until the expiration date.** A yearly \$25.00 fee for permit parking is due with the new application. Checks or money orders can be made payable to the "Borough of West Conshohocken".

All rules and regulations of the 8 Merion Avenue Permit Parking Lot will be enforced. Anyone not displaying a current permit parking tag issued by the Borough of West Conshohocken is subject to a parking fine.

Anyone who would like to renew their parking permit and receive their new permit parking tag can do so at the West Conshohocken Police Department, Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Applicants must be a resident or business owner, must provide proof of residence or business ownership in the form of a photo identification card and a utility bill. Permits are limited to one per resident or business and one vehicle per resident or business. A \$25.00 registration fee is required each year to obtain a permit.

Officers continue to monitor and enforce all parking complaints, issues and concerns throughout the Borough. Residents and businesses are encouraged to contact the Police Department to report any parking complaints or concerns so that they may be addressed immediately.

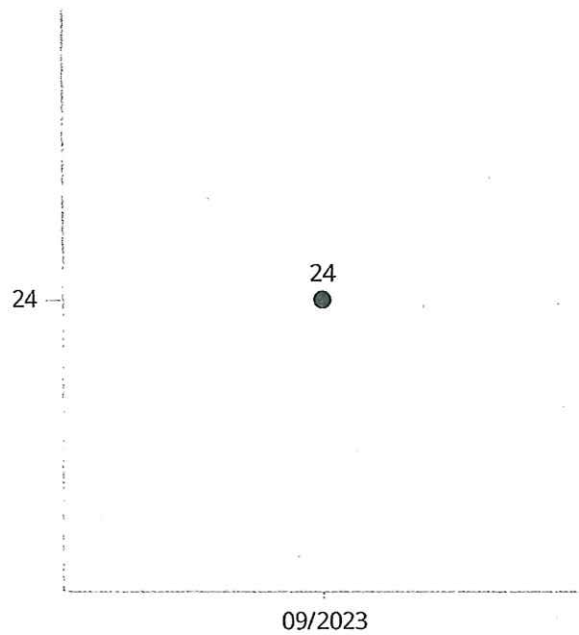

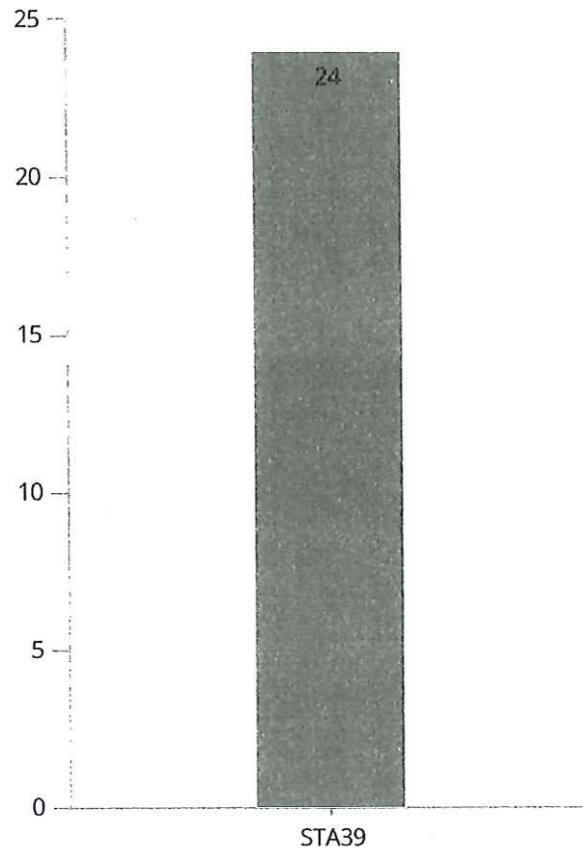
Incident Count by Month



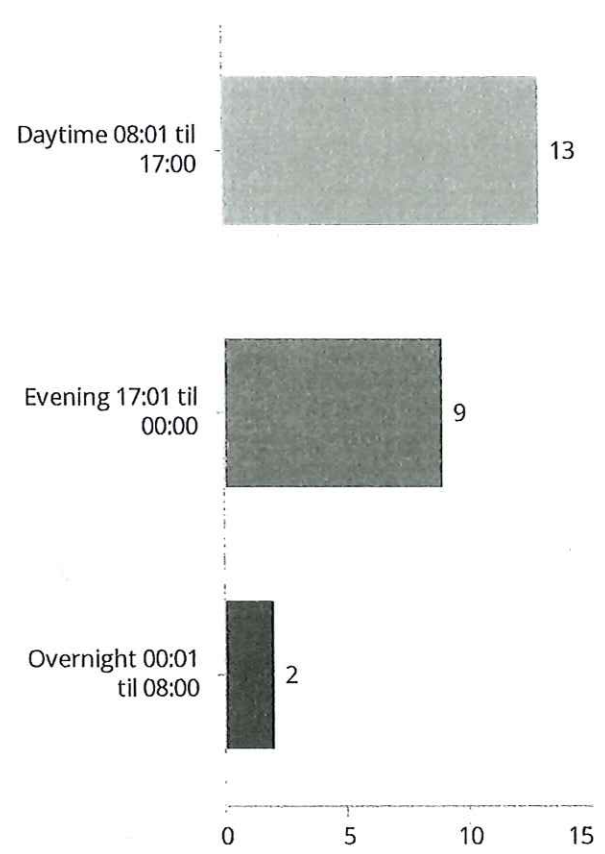

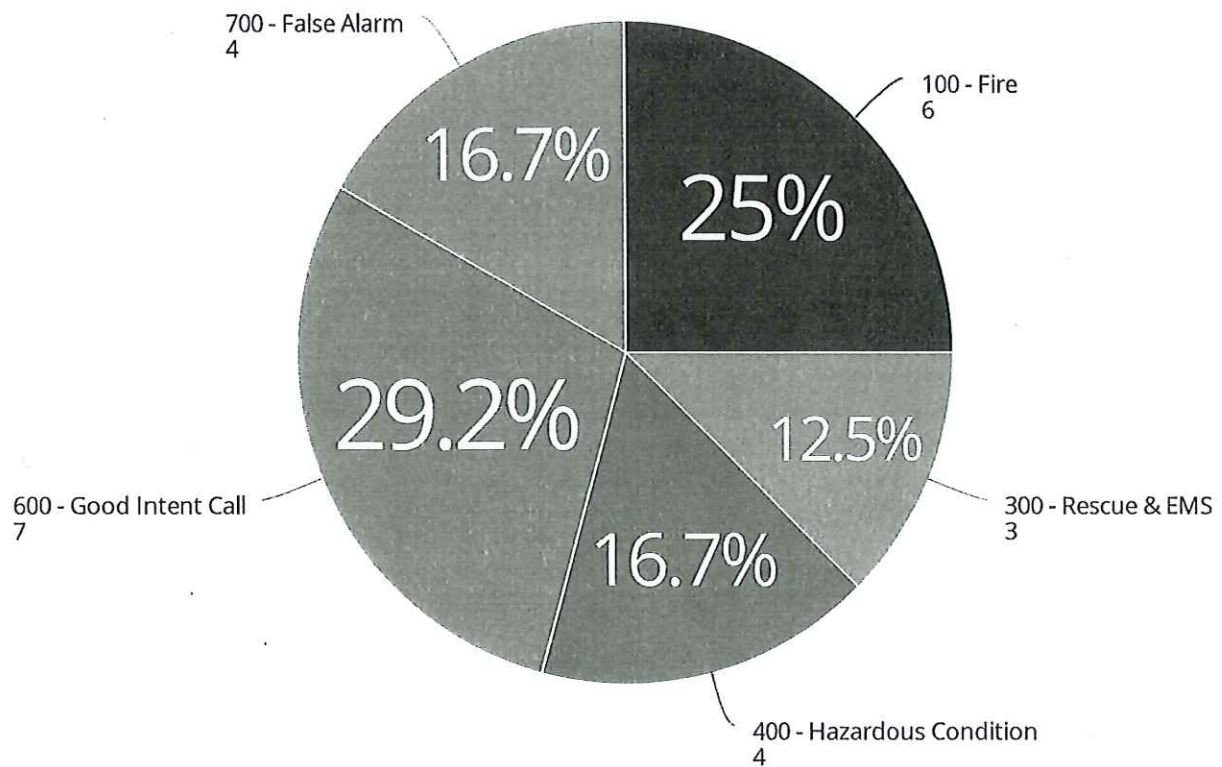

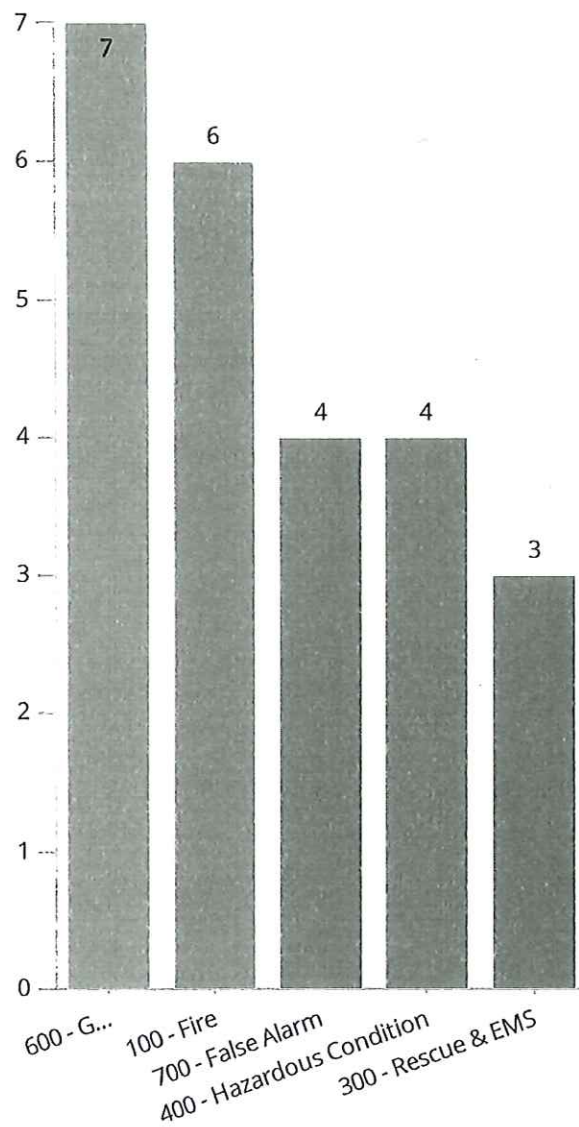

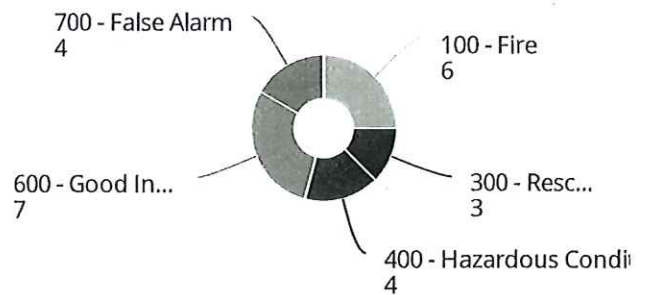

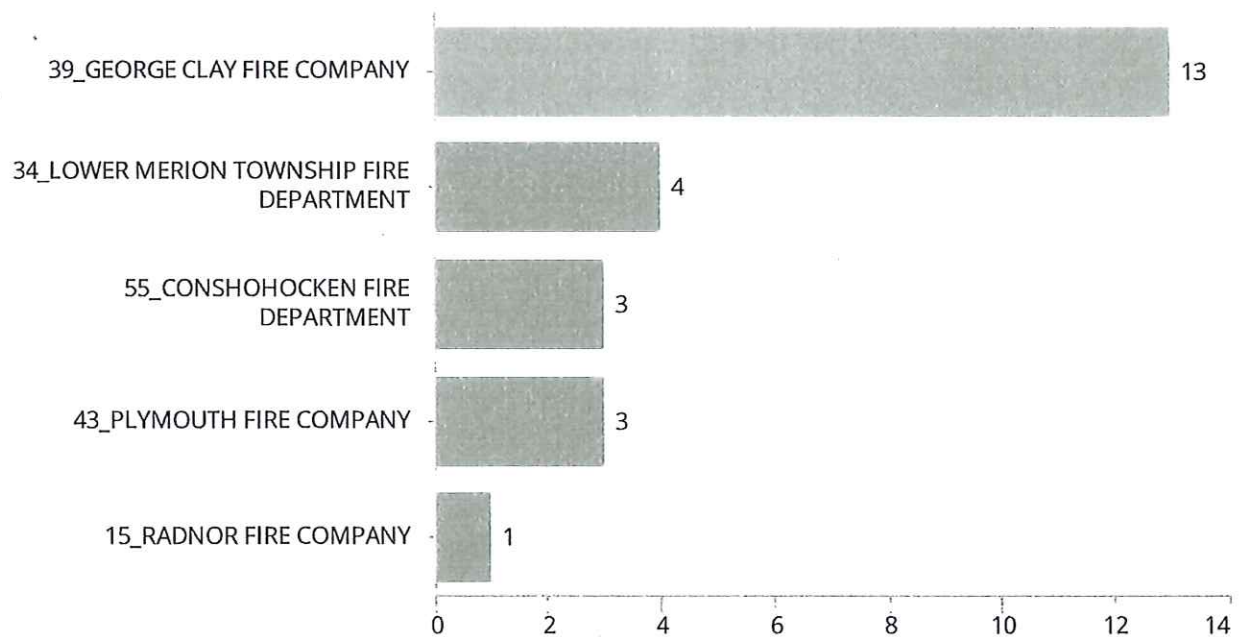

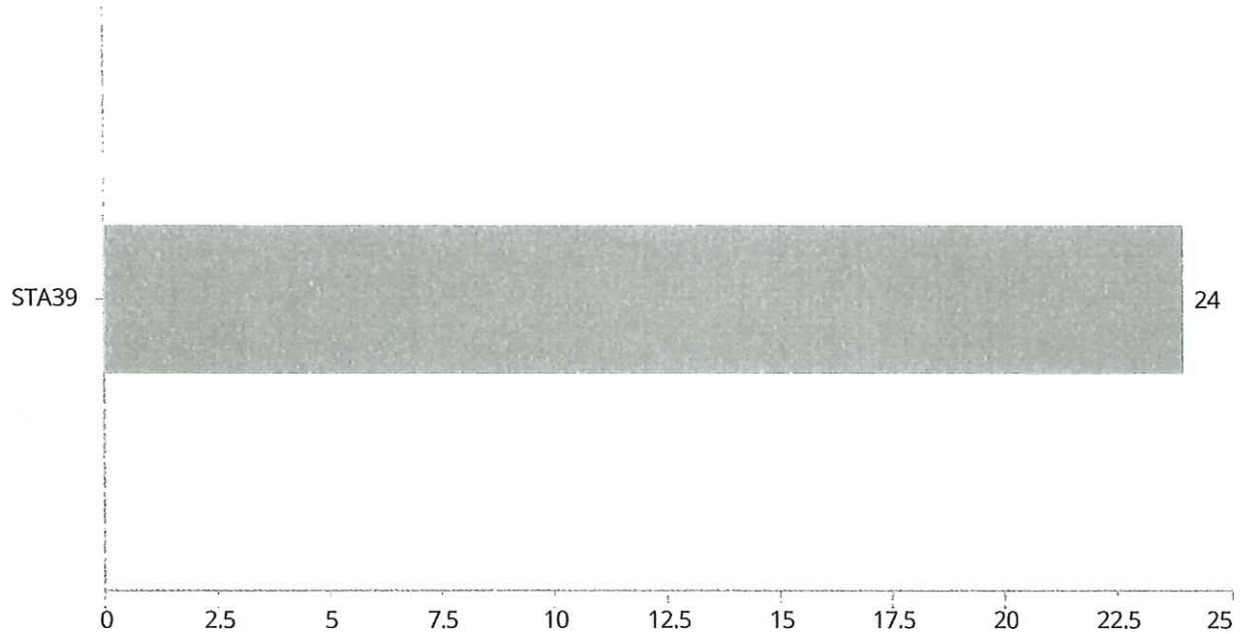
Count of Incidents by District

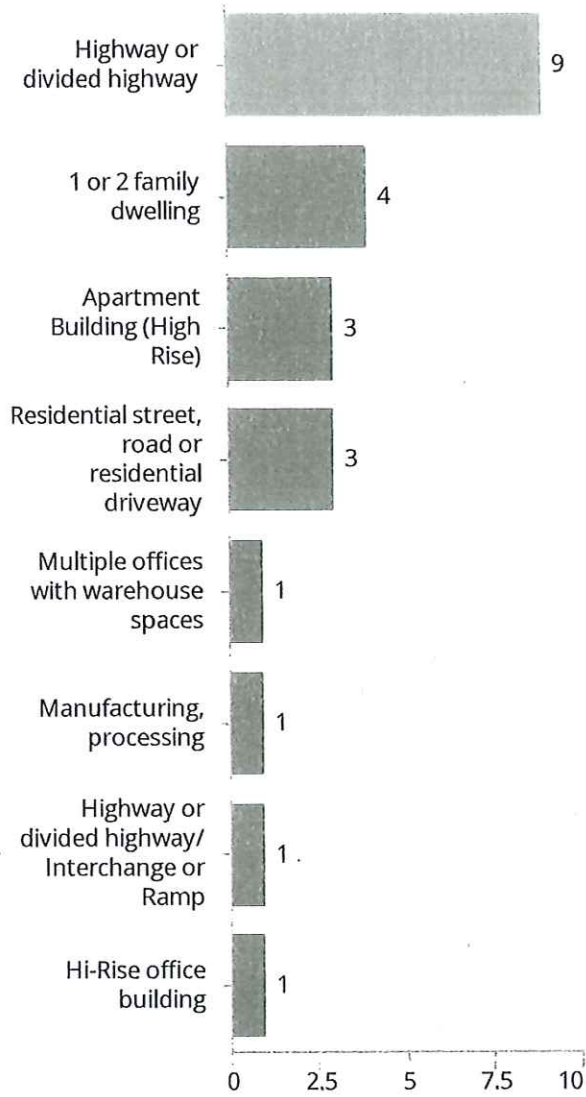

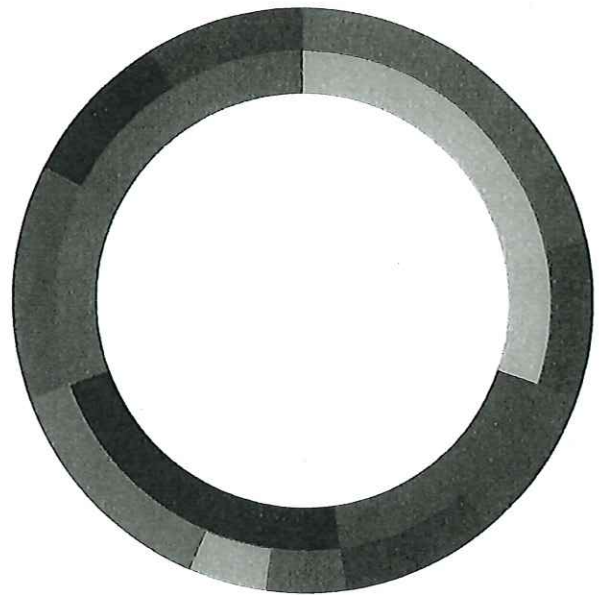

For submission to the consent agenda of West Conshohocken Borough Council, October 10, 2023:

At the September 7, 2023 meeting, The Planning Commission reviewed the **updated** draft Official Map developed by Penoni dated 6/21/23. Below are comments for consideration on enhancements to the draft Official Map:

- Extend “planned open space parcel” designation along the Schuylkill River bank further South to recover existing underutilized surface parking at 300-400 Barr Harbor Dr
 - **Not included in June 21 2023 Draft Official Map. The goal of this designation as an opportunity for future conversion of existing surface parking to open green space, which is desired to create a larger, more usable riverfront, and to enhance the access commitments made by 400 Barr Harbor for access. Additionally there is uncertainty around the development timeline and an active extensions request to Zoning. Part of the approved plan includes a high-rise parking garage, likely lessening the need for existing surface lot parking, creating an opportunity for conversion to green space.**
- Incorporate trail designations aligned with West Conshohocken Open Space Plan (2006):
 - page 41, *Figure 24 Master Trail Plan*
 - page 43, *Figure 26 Schuylkill Heritage Trail Plan*
 - page 45, *Figure 29 Balligomingo Trail Plan*
 - *Expand trail map markings to adjoining municipalities within the current map scope, including connections to known existing or proposed trails per Montco 2040 Plan.*

The above bullet points are included in first update, thank you.

- **NEW - Add “signage” to Penoni updates stated in 4.j. pedestrian bridge, as per Vision Plan.**
