Mr. English indicated that his report is in the packet. Mr. English highlighted the Council Reorganization meeting will be held on January 2, 2024. The Tree Lighting event will take place on November 25th and Borough Hall will be closing early on November 22nd, closed on November 23rd and 24th for the Thanksgiving holiday.

Mr. Stephen English indicated that there are two assessment appeals for 300 Conshohocken State Road and 1001 Conshohocken State Road. Questions were presented for due to the large increase of 408-Engineering Services, which Mr. English indicated there are several projects coming up.

Chris Cella asked about the increase in 426- Recycling Collection, which Michael English indicated that the recycling bin prices increased

Mr. English address 430-Public Works, discussions took place regarding healthcare, overtime, rental equipment, vehicle and equipment purchases. Motion to table to December for further information on life span/warranty on equipment. Motioned by Zach Nelson and Seconded by Tori Conicello-Emery and passed 6-0.

Guy Davis, resident, wanted to know when Phase I wanted to be completed. If the last three phases will be bundled there are still concerns of the dog park. Mr. Davis wanted to know if Simone Collins has been engaged for zoning ordinance? Mr. Davis wanted to know the status of establishing the Shade Tree Commission. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that we are having an issue with getting members for the zoning board and working on the Shade Tree Commission. Now that election has been completed and full Council and work will begin on working on Official Map and then working on the zoning overlay. Mr. Hassan indicated that the phases II, III and III the dog park is not included. The completed project would be between 90 or 120 days from start to finish. More accurate dates are forthcoming.

Dave Frankenfield, resident, spoke about storm drains crates that need to be replaced and street lights that need to be repaired and also requested additional fire hydrants. Mr. Frankenfield indicated that there are holiday events that will be held at George Clay. Mr. Blumenthal addressed Mr. Frankenfield's concerns of lights around the Elizabeth Street area.

II. COMMITTEE REPORT:

Please add to the next council meeting that we need to vote on letting the police department run their own interviews, we are holding up the process!

The police department would like to end the K-9 program and officially retire our dog, we are not using the dog as often as we'd like, it's an extra cost for the department that just isn't necessary now. We will need to put this to council for a full vote but the committee expressed favor for this item.

Could we take a look at the potential sinkhole on Barr Harbor by the underpass with the engineer?

Fire Marshall

• the hotel in West Conshohocken is currently on fire watch as they need a pump replacement which may potentially take weeks or months, will be sending hourly logs.

Codes Officer

 PECO is currently scheduling double pole removal within West Conshohocken, they are backlogged because of failing poles. They also received a quote for iPads for the Fire Marshall and Codes Officer to better enable them access to ESO, will share with Borough Management.

Police Department

• would like authority to end the K-9 program and retire the dog to her officer handler's home, the costs are outweighing the benefits as it is not something we use often and we don't have the manpower to share the resource with other municipalities.

Fire Department

- They have provided a list of additional items that they would like to get approved outside of the budget. These include:
 - 1. \$50,000 of earmarked funds for MSA air packs and 5 sets of turnout gear in the future
 - 2. Replacement apparatus and Quint
 - 3. They are asking for a second full-time employee
 - 4. They would like to replace the engine room bay doors (\$15,000 for parts and would do the labor on a volunteer basis)
 - 5. Basement restoration and renovation ask for their training area (\$46,250 estimate)
 - 6. They are requesting additional hydrants one at the industrial park on DeHaven and an additional by the office buildings on Front Street. They will create a list and will send to the Fire Marshall. They also asked that all new developments require installation of fire hydrants.
- The fire department also had a question about the budget there used to be a \$7700 per year cleaning line item that is no longer there. In addition, they had a question about line item 02-411-320 and if they were double paying for this.

Public Comment:

- Mr. Davis asked that regarding apparatus replacement for the fire department, if it was
 possible for the department to provide a quarterly asset report so there are no surprises at
 replacement time. In addition, he asked that we could agree on what percentage the borough
 should pay towards apparatus purchases so we could eliminate negotiations.
- Mr. Dave Frankenfield mentioned that Mr. Catagnus has a list of streetlights needing replacement within the Borough.
- Mr. Dennis Frankenfield mentioned again that there is a sinkhole on Barr Harbor by the underpass; could we have the engineer look at it?

- The Police Department continues updating and finalizing the Department's new Policy and Procedures Manual. Thanks to the Aspirant Consulting Group for writing and updating our new policies.

- All of the Department's Officers are completing their mandatory Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training (MPOETC) update courses for 2023.
- Every month, all of the Police Department's Officers participate in multiple online training through Police One Academy.

- Officers attended and completed Crime Scene and Evidence Collection training in November.

2024 Police Department Budget

- The Police Department will be finalizing its 2024 Budget with the Borough Council.

Police Department Hiring Process

The Police Department is in the process of scheduling oral interviews for each applicant. After interviews are completed, each applicant will undergo a background investigation and polygraph examination.

FLEET MANAGEMENT

Police Vehicles

The Department's Fleet Management Officers maintain Police vehicle maintenance records. These updated records are stored under the Departments online web based Fleet Management / GPS System. This system tracks each vehicle and alerts Officers of any upcoming vehicle maintenance that needs to be scheduled.

TRAFFIC & PARKING

Traffic

The Police Department continues monitoring all of the Borough's traffic areas and any requests by residents for problem traffic areas. Every day of

the week, Officers conduct daily traffic details throughout the Borough. All residents and businesses are encouraged to contact the Police Department to report any traffic complaints or concerns so that we may address them immediately.

Permit Parking

Anyone who would like to obtain a parking permit or receive a new one can do so at the West Conshohocken Police Department, Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Applicants must be a resident or business owner, must provide proof of residence or business ownership in the form of a photo identification card and a utility bill. Permits are limited to one per resident or business and one vehicle per resident or business. A \$25.00 registration fee is required each year to obtain a permit.

Officers monitor, enforce and conduct parking details daily and respond to all parking complaints, issues and concerns throughout the Borough. Residents and businesses are encouraged to contact the Police Department to report any parking complaints or concerns.

Percent of Incident Responses by Incident Type







ORDINANCE NO. 2023-04 WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ADOPTING THE OFFICIAL MAP OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN.

WHEREAS, Article IV of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, Act 247 of 1968, as reenacted and amended, 53 P.S. § 10401 ("MPC"), authorizes the Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken ("Borough") to make or cause to be made an "Official Map" of all or a portion of the Borough which may show appropriate elements or portions of elements of the Borough Comprehensive Plan, and which may include, but need not be limited to existing and proposed public streets, watercourses and public grounds, including widenings, narrowings, extensions, diminutions, openings or closing of same; existing and proposed public parks, playgrounds and open space reservations; pedestrian ways and easements; railroad and transit rights-of-way and easements; flood control basins, floodways and flood plains, stormwater management areas and drainage easements; and support facilities;

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §1203, authorizes the Borough Council to make and adopt ordinances not inconsistent with or restrained by the Constitution of Pennsylvania and laws of this Commonwealth as may be expedient or necessary for the proper management, care and control of the Borough and its finances and the maintenance of peace, good government, safety and welfare of the borough and its trade, commerce and manufactures;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council deems it to be in the best interest and the general welfare of the citizens and residents of the Borough to adopt an Official Map of the Borough of West Conshohocken;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has met the procedural requirements of the MPC for the adoption of the proposed Ordinance, including holding a public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, to wit:

§I. <u>RECITALS</u>.

The recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

§II. <u>LEGISLATIVE INTENT</u>.

Article IV of the MPC authorizes the Borough Council of the Borough of West

Conshohocken to adopt an Official Map of the Borough of West Conshohocken designating and reserving areas for future streets, and other municipal facilities.

§III. ADOPTION OF OFFICIAL MAP.

The Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken hereby adopts the Official Map prepared by Pennoni Associates Inc., dated April 10, 2023 and last revised June 27, 2023, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A", as the Official Map of the Borough of West Conshohocken.

SIV. INCORPORATION OF GOVERNING LAW.

The provisions of Article IV of the MPC are hereby incorporated by reference to govern the effect of the adoption of the Official Map, issuance of permits and approvals for land reserved on the Official Map, and all other matters relating to the Official Map.

§V. AMENDMENTS TO OFFICIAL MAP.

Any amendments to the Official Map shall be made in a manner consistent with Article IV of the MPC.

§VI. RECORDING OF OFFICIAL MAP.

The West Conshohocken Borough officials are authorized to take all steps necessary to record the Official Map in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in and for Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, as required by Section 402(c) of the MPC. The West Conshohocken Borough officials are further authorized to transmit certified copies of the Official Map to those entities required to be provided with such copies by the MPC.

§VII. REVISIONS.

The Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken hereby reserves the right, from time to time, to adopt modifications of, supplements to, or amendments of this Ordinance.

§VIII. REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, it being understood and intended that all ordinances and the Code of the Borough of West Conshohocken, such as are not otherwise specifically in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect, the same being reaffirmed hereby.

ŞIX. SEVERABILITY.

If any sentence, clause, section, term, phrase or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or

invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, terms, provisions, or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared the intent of the Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such an unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, section, or part thereof not had been included herein.

§X. FAILURE TO ENFORCE NOT A WAIVER.

The failure of the Borough to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Borough of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

§XI. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately.

§XII. ENACTMENT.



RESOLUTION NO. 2023-19 WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

A RESOLUTION OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AFFIXING THE TAX RATE FOR THE YEAR 2024.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken that a tax be the same is hereby levied on all real property within West Conshohocken Borough subject to taxation for the fiscal year 2024 as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** Tax rate for general purposes, the sum of 1.07 mills on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of \$0.107 on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.
- **SECTION 2.** Tax rate for fire protection purposes, the sum of .110 mills on each dollar of assessed valuation, or the sum of \$0.011 on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.
- **SECTION 3.** A taxpayer subject to the payment of tax levied by this Resolution shall be entitled to a discount of two (2%) percent for the amount of such tax upon making payment of the whole amount of such tax within two (2) months after the date of the tax notice.
- **SECTION 4.** The taxpayer subject to the payment of the tax levied by this Resolution who shall make payment of such tax for four (4) months after the date of the tax notice shall be charged a penalty of ten (10%) percent, of which shall be added to the tax by the Tax Collector and shall be collected by the Tax Collector.
- **SECTION 5.** That any resolution, or part of resolution, conflicting with this Resolution be and the same is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Resolution.

SECTION 6. The effective date of this Resolution is January 1, 2024.
