XI. NEW BUSINESS

1. Council shall evaluate and take potential action on Resolution No. 2024-02, which would officially acknowledge the list of participating members submitted to Council by the George Clay Fire Company Fire Chief. The Pennsylvania Workers' Compensation Act allows for a fire company to expand coverage under said Act to include participating members of a fire company. The Act defines a "participating member" of a volunteer fire department or volunteer fire company as one who provides necessary operational support to the volunteer fire department or volunteer fire company, but does not respond to emergency calls. This Resolution officially acknowledges the list of participating members submitted to Council by the George Clay Fire Company Fire Chief.
2. Council shall evaluate and take potential action on Resolution No. 2024-03, proposed by the West Conshohocken Borough Council President, which would create a new International Fire Code Board of Appeals of the Borough of West Conshohocken. The International Fire Code provides for a Fire Code Board of Appeals to hear and decide appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the Borough Fire Code Official relative to the application and interpretation of the Code. This Resolution shall appoint 5 members to the West Conshohocken Fire Board of Appeals.
3. Council shall evaluate and take potential action on Resolution No. 2024-04, proposed by the Council President to formally authorize the submission of a grant application for the year 2024. The grant provides funding for phase 2 renovations and upgrades of MacKenzie Park.

The amended Budget has to be adopted by February 15th to which Mr. English recommends utilizing this based upon the grants received. Mr. English indicated that there more cyber security issues on the rise and suggested that that Council approve additional premium to increase coverage to one million dollars with a \$25,000 deductible which will be covered by PA Intergovernmental Association. Mr. Khal Hassan wanted to discuss Phase 1 of MacKenzie park. A Pre-construction mtg took place on December 22nd with contractor to discuss fire safety, schedule, scope, material and expectations for public projects. On January 4th contractors were issued with notice to proceed. Blacktop, concrete and other materials have been submitted to Pennoni which are currently under review and comments have been provided. Pennoni will keep everyone up to date along with future grant updates. No questions were presented.

1. Confirmed appointment for 17-37 Front Street

Mr. Iannozzi briefed Council and the public on the definition of a confirmed appointment. Mr. Iannozzi clarified that no plans have been submitted and Council has no knowledge of what is being presented.

Mr. Jim Garrity was present and announced his team which included their Architect, Mark and Jeff Brown of Korman Communities, Chris McGarrity and Mike Sloan along with Nate Burns for the potential to build a mixed-use residential/ retail building at the block of 17-37 Front Street and incorporating this with the Vision Plan. Mr. Garrity discussed the plan a 25-floor building, consisting of 7 floors of parking, 2 parking garages, 258 living units, such as studios, one and two bedrooms, 15,000 square feet of retail, high end restaurants and amenities. Also discussed was outdoor sitting along with entrances. Mr. Garrity also indicated that a tax study is being completed to show the increase in tax revenue. Mr. Korman and his architect also discussed drawings in more detail and working on green energy.

Council had concerns of the traffic and building height. Borough Engineer questioned the calculations behind parking and calculations of living units. Presenters confirmed that these would be apartments only. Council has concerns of parking for residents, businesses and also the demand on the housing market. Council requested that more discussions could take place when the information was further clarified. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that public comment will be taken at the end

2. Confirmed appointment for 218 Brittmoir Avenue regarding Vacation of Paper Street Request.

John Iannozzi indicated that the attorney Mark Danek filed an application to vacate a paper alley for current project of a subdivision which was already approved in zoning. Mr. Danek represents Jeffrey and Betty Stanley who own two parcels and currently working on a single-family development so vacating this paper alley would allow a driveway into the residence. Borough Engineer Khal Hassan indicated that the paper alley ends and doesn't serve the Borough. Mr. Blumenthal asked for a motion to begin procedure to advertise. There were no questions from Council or the public. John Iannozzi indicated that this will be before Council at public hearing in March.

4. Public works full-time employee position update

Mr. English indicated that this was discussed at the December Council meeting and Robert Dronitsky was present. Mr. English indicated that advertisement for the full time position will move forward and will provide an update at next Council meeting. Amelia Gale had indicated that it was getting more difficult in locating a seasonal employee.

5. Supplemental Fire Services Equipment Update

Mr. English wanted to clarify the supplemental request for air packs and turn out gear more specifically. Mr. English indicated that there is \$113,000 at Truist for the fire company can be used to purchase these items. Dennis Frankenfield indicated that the air packs won't be purchased this year and would like to order them next year and it turn would cost approximately \$25,000 each. The turn-out gear would be replacing 5 sets this year for approximately 40,000.00. Mr. Blumenthal discussed options on amending the budget or using the money market account. Mr. Ewing wanted to clarify the correct amounts of 40,000 for turnout gear and \$25,000 to be held aside for next year for the air packs. Mr. Blumenthal asked for a motion to set the money aside and not amend the budget this year.

Kevin Fallon, resident, indicated the agenda was not clear enough for residents regarding the confirmed appointments. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that there was no knowledge of the what was being proposed. Mr. Fallon questioned the reversal of the pig ordinance and wanted to make sure that neighbors were aware of this as he is a resident that has concerns.

Jessica Wong, resident, wanted to address Mr. Fallon's concerns with failure to abide by Borough Ordinance. Mr. Iannozzi gave Ms. Wong an update regarding a proposed ordinance.

Mr. Blumenthal thanked everyone for their time for the lengthy meeting this evening and the cooperation of the shared fire service discussions. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that there would be better explanation on future agendas.

Subject: Public Safety Notes - Jan 18, 2024

Team,

Please see below for the meeting notes from January 18. Key takeaways are that we are progressing nicely with hiring for the police department, and also there is a request to inspect the sinkhole on Barr Harbor. Could the Engineer please handle this?

The Chair began by commending the Public Works department for their great job at clearing the snow as well as keeping residents safe during the most recent storms. We also made an announcement calling attention to the mistake in the state rep newsletter that said there were plans for a dog park with the Mackenzie Park upgrade project, and to correct that this had not ever been discussed. In addition, the Chair made an announcement that Mr. Bob Hedden would be the liaison from DCED working with the regionalization task force, and that expectations would be set for clear communication and collaboration with the task force's members. The task force will take place at separate meetings from council and the public safety committee meetings, will send dates that work for everyone involved.

- Fire Marshall's Report:
 - Looking into permanent mount floodgates, Buckingham Township is pricing these for us as an option as road flooding keeps happening
 - The Marriott is still under fire watch, there has been no update as to replacement of their water pump
- Code Inspector Report:
 - Inspections happening because of the latest snow
- Police Department:
 - Saturday, Feb 3 oral interviews will take place. There are 7 applicants, who will have 45 minute interviews each, all with current Chiefs or Lieutenants. They then do testing and have the results by the following Monday. They have also started preliminary background checks, have another company that handles references, so we could be hiring by March/April
 - We are also registered for the April consortium just in case, as ideally we'd like to hire 4 officers.
- George Clay:

- The LOSAP will be ready to go by February's council meeting, they're just getting signatures now
- Update on boats - we have them now but they're not operational because of training, which needs to take place when the weather breaks. Currently there are 11 emergency operators certified. They are also working on registration and insurance application
- They would like to have the Chief and Assistant Chiefs, Treasurer, and President of George Clay on the regionalization task force
- This year, they would like to add purchases to the budget for thermal gear to prevent hypothermia/exposure, as well as prop guards
- Public Comment:
 - Dennis Frankenfield - he asked who would initiate conversations with other municipalities, as he has concerns which municipalities we would choose - he believes UM, LM and Conshohocken would be the best partners. Also, brought up that last time floodgates were proposed he remembered there being a legal issue with liability
 - Dave Frankenfield - clarified that the legal objection to the floodgates was regarding who was responsible for making the decision to put them up and whether it would be done timely enough. If a car drives through anyway and gets stuck, that's billable EMS time and they can be fined. There is also potentially more liability if you have them and don't put them out. He will send a list of requested add'l fire hydrants to the Marshall, currently taking measurements. Also, the street light on Front Street between the Dry Cleaner and 150 block need to be replaced or put up. He has also seen progression of the double pole cleanup
 - Chad Piper - requesting to be on the task force, is currently completing training and would like to eventually join the fire department
 - Walter Gleba - has there been follow-up on the sink hole on Barr Harbor? Can the Engineer please take a look at this?

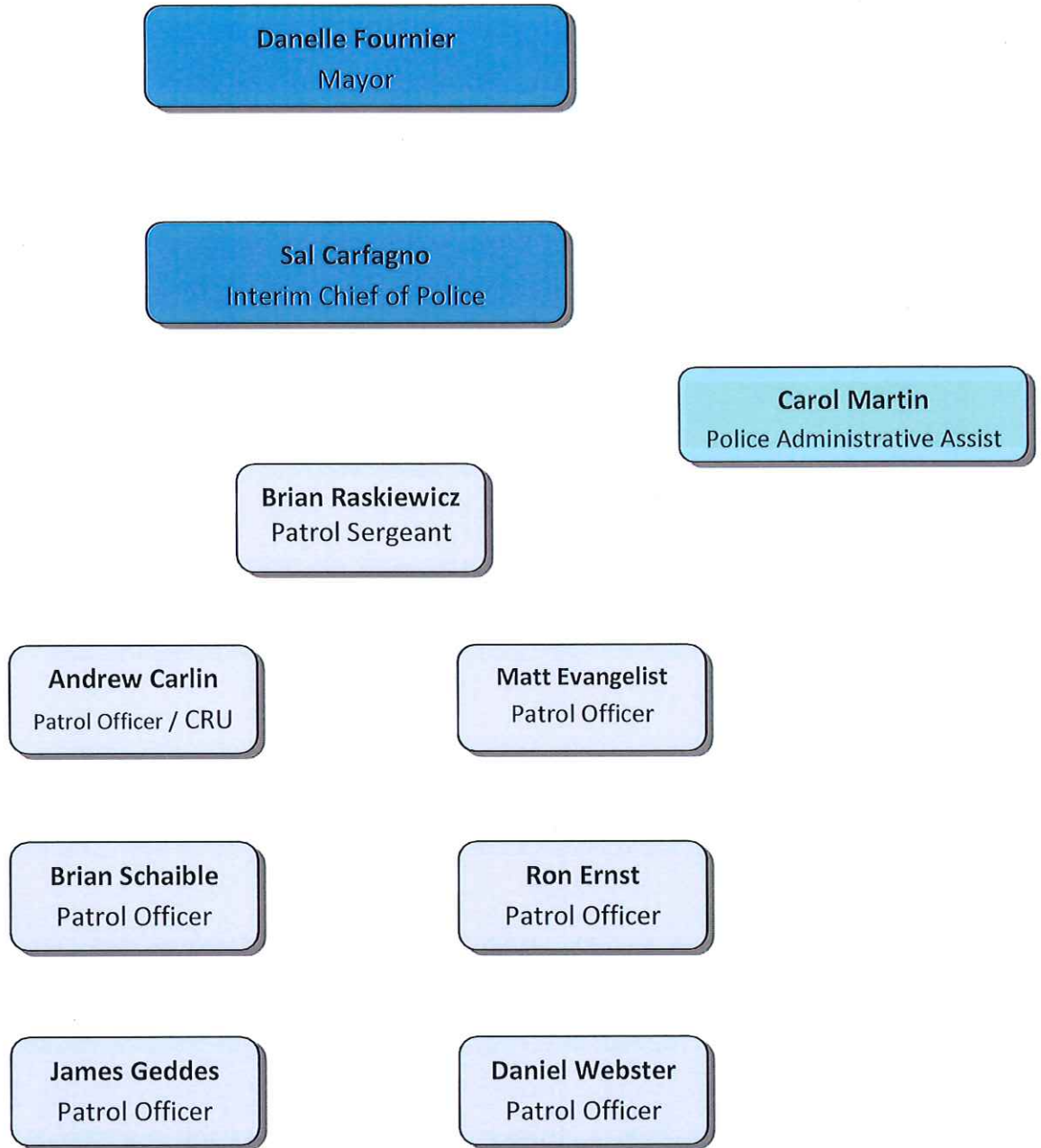

NEW EQUIPMENT

Digital Ticket Devices

The Police Department purchased three (3) new handheld portable ticket devices. These wireless devices are the latest technology used for issuing tickets. These devices link directly to the local court system, send the information electronically and eliminate the need for paper tickets. Once, final approval from the AOPC (Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts) the devices can be placed into operation.

The Police Department continues monitoring all of the Borough's traffic areas and any requests by residents for problem traffic areas. Officers conduct daily traffic details throughout the Borough. Permit Parking

All current permit-parking registrations from last year expired as of December 31, 2023. Parking permits or renewals can be picked up at the West Conshohocken Police Department, Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. Applicants must be a resident or business owner, must provide proof of residence or business ownership in the form of a photo identification card and a utility bill. Permits are limited to one per resident or

business and one vehicle per resident or business. A \$25.00 registration fee is required each year to obtain a permit.

Officers monitor, enforce and conduct parking details daily. Please contact the Police Department to report any parking complaints, issues or concerns.

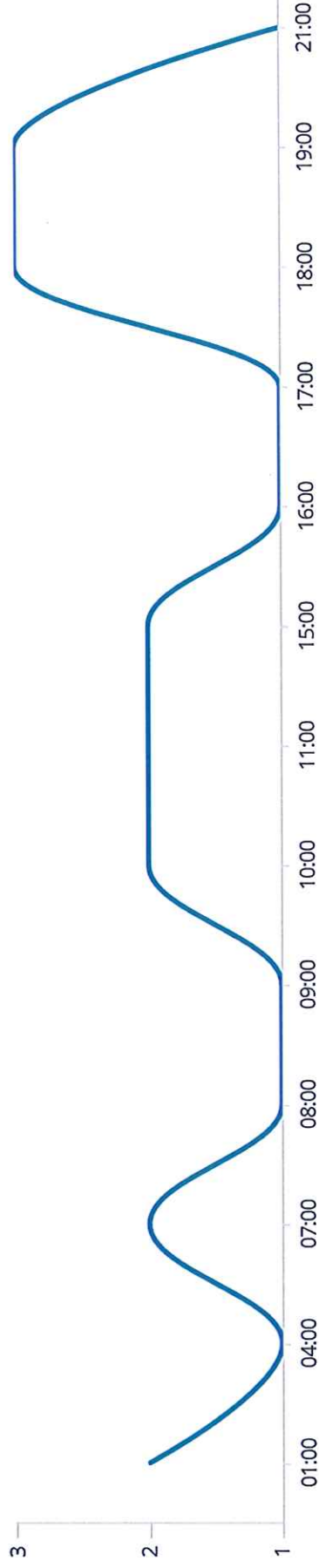

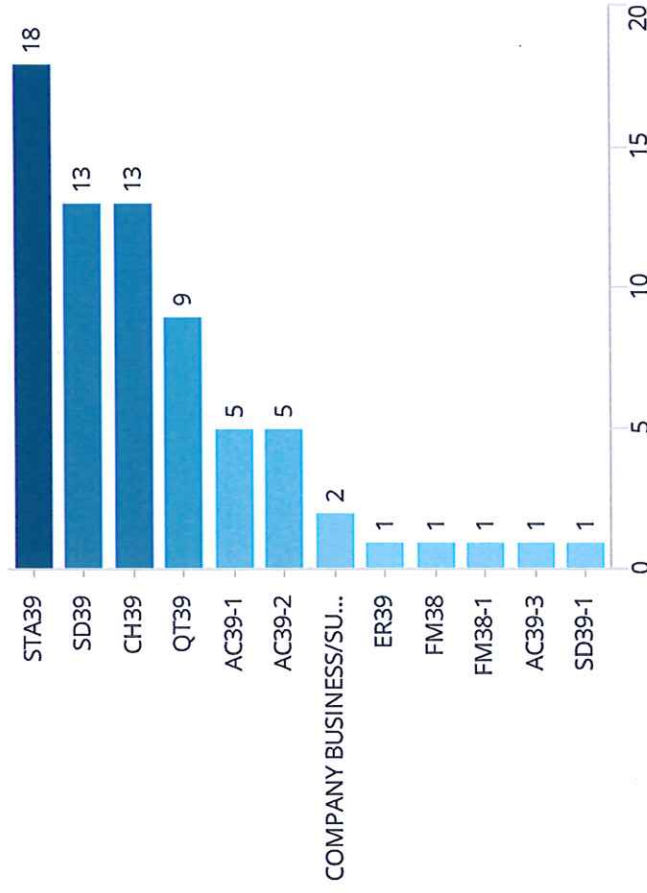

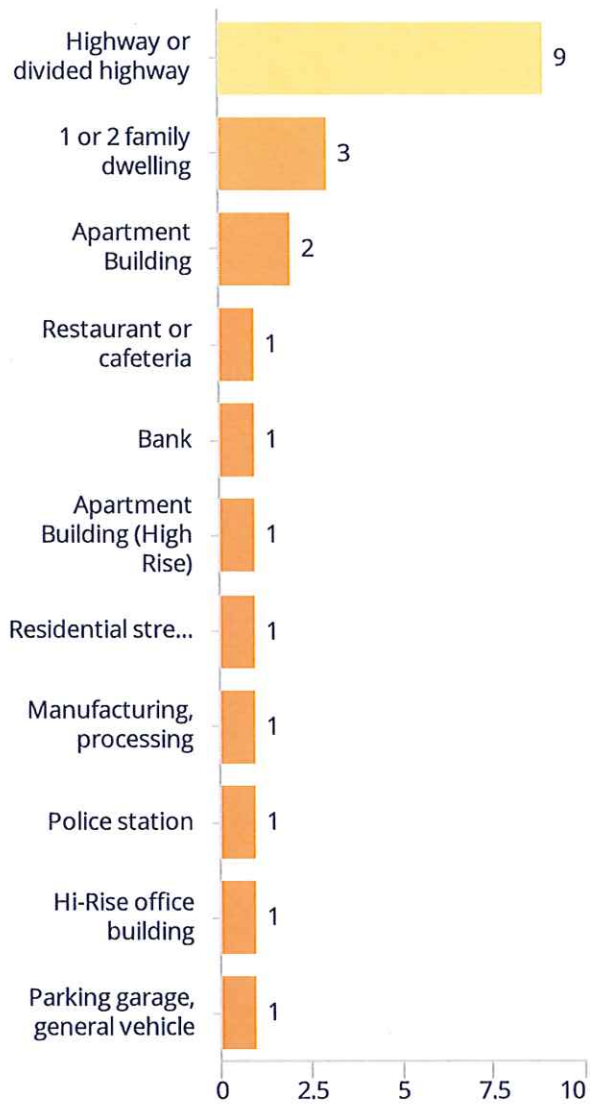

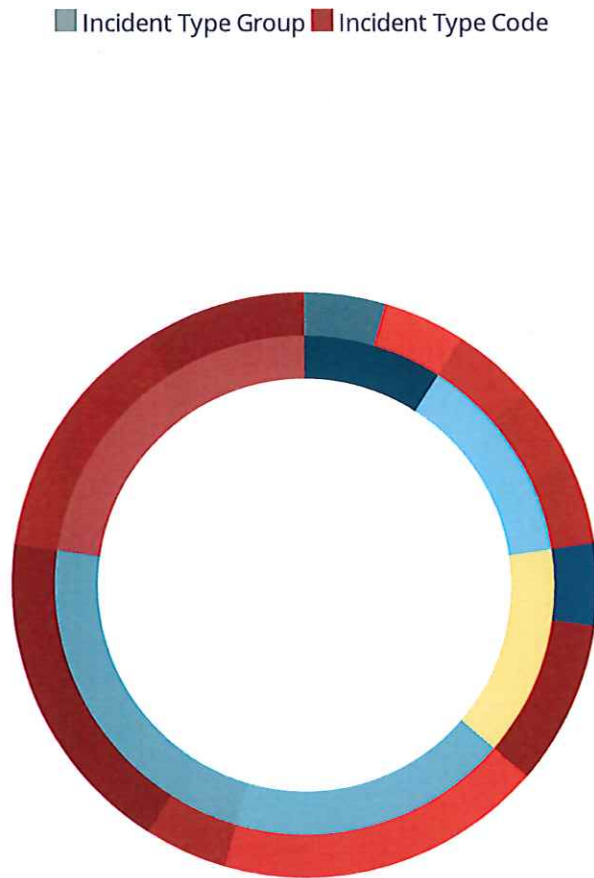

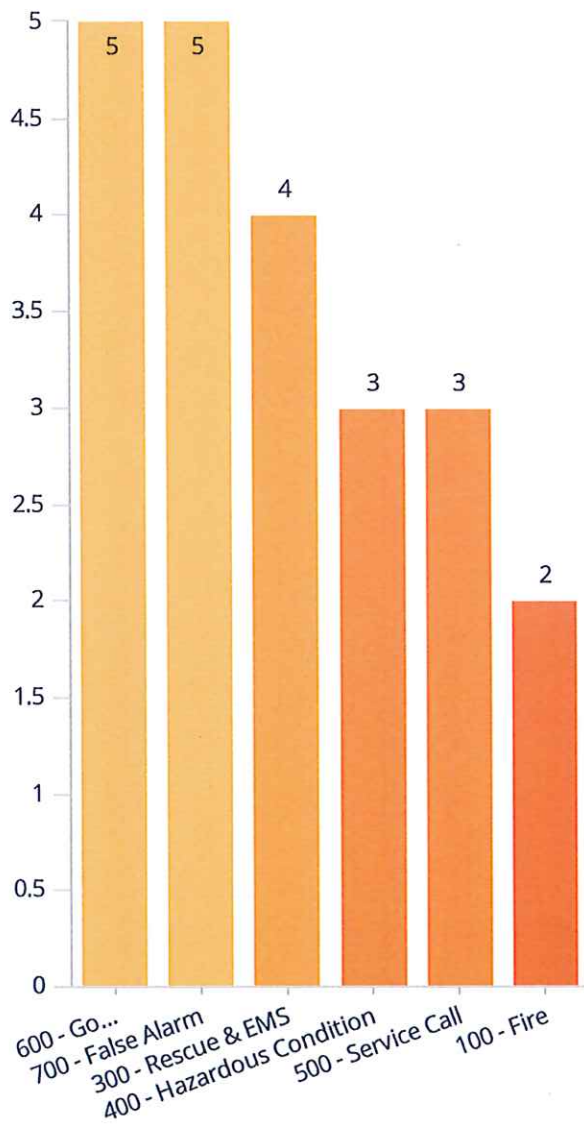

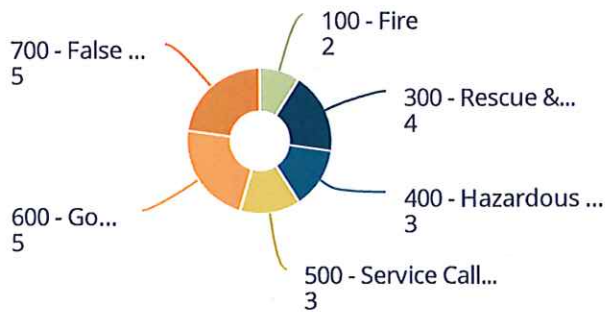

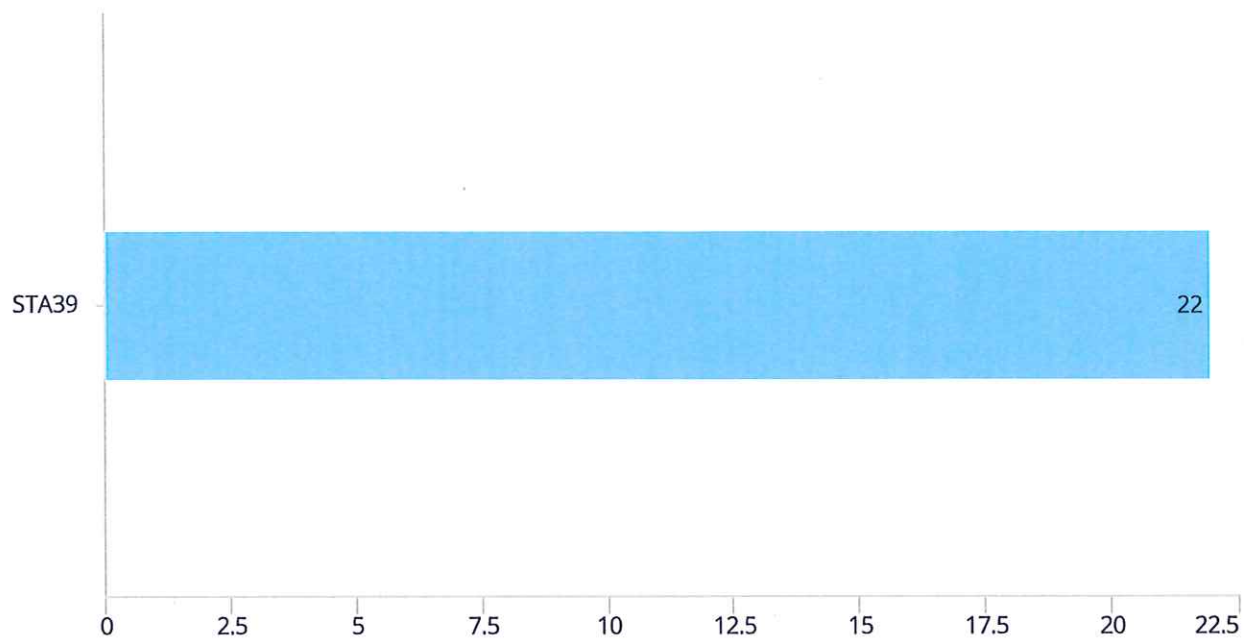
Count of Incidents by District

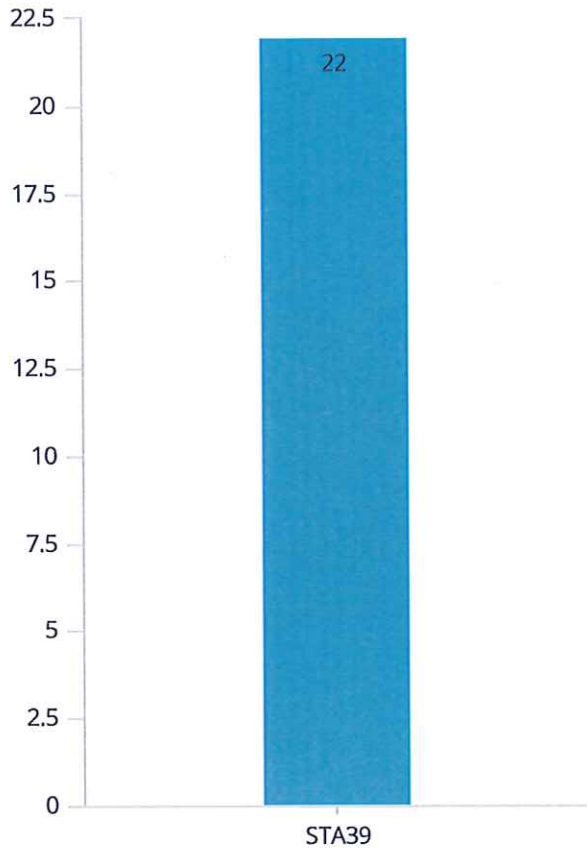
Incident Count by Month



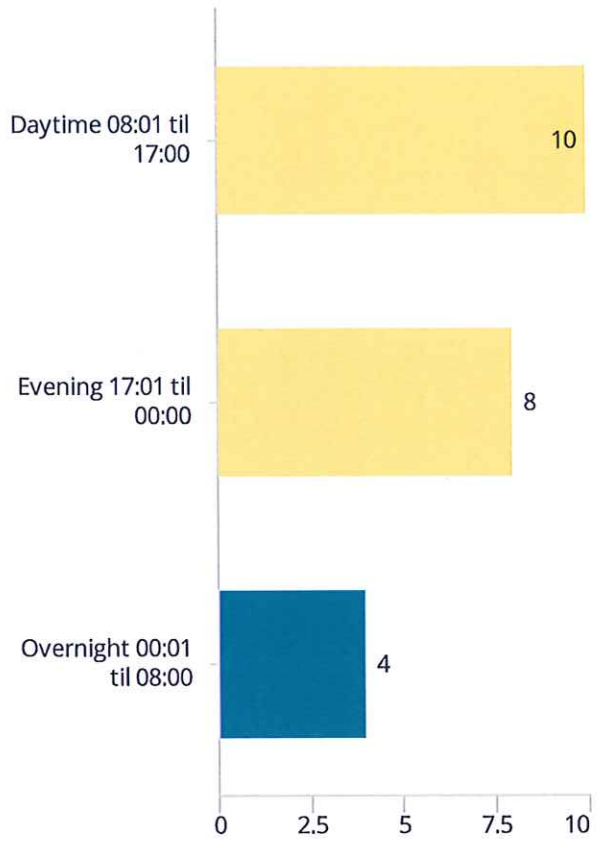

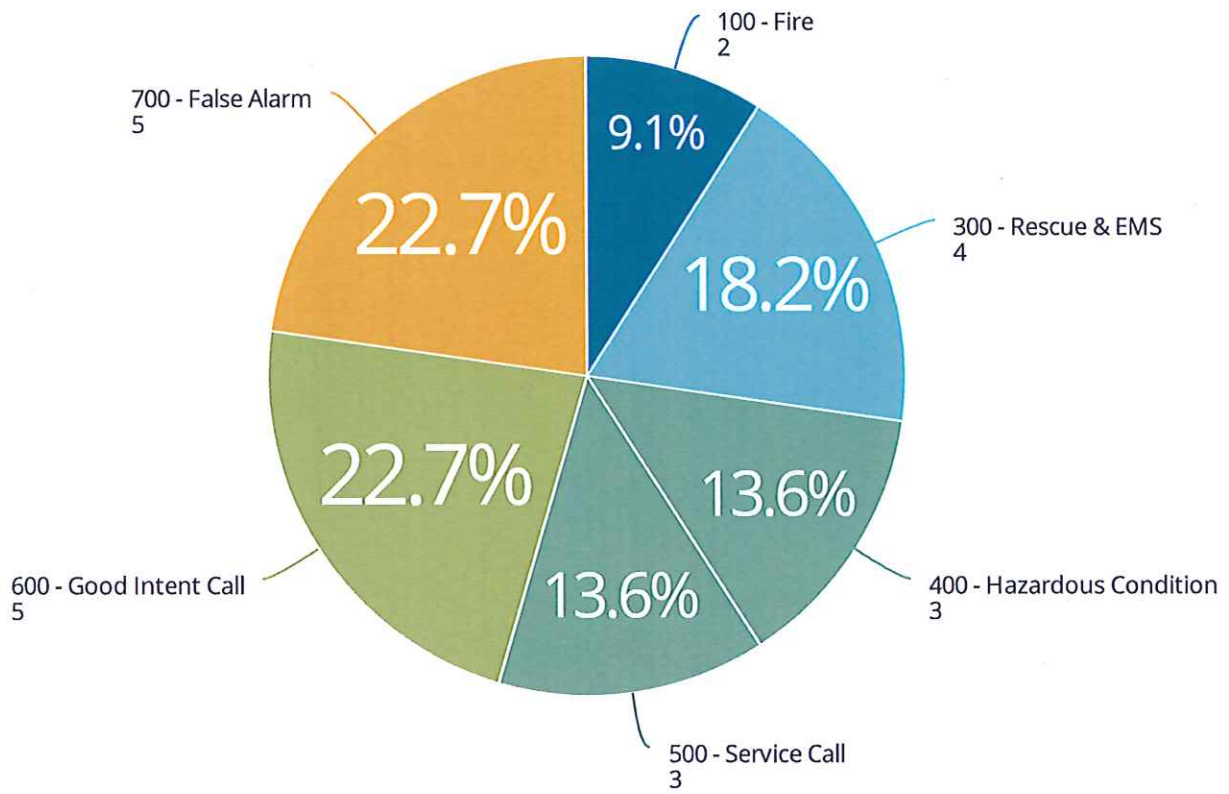

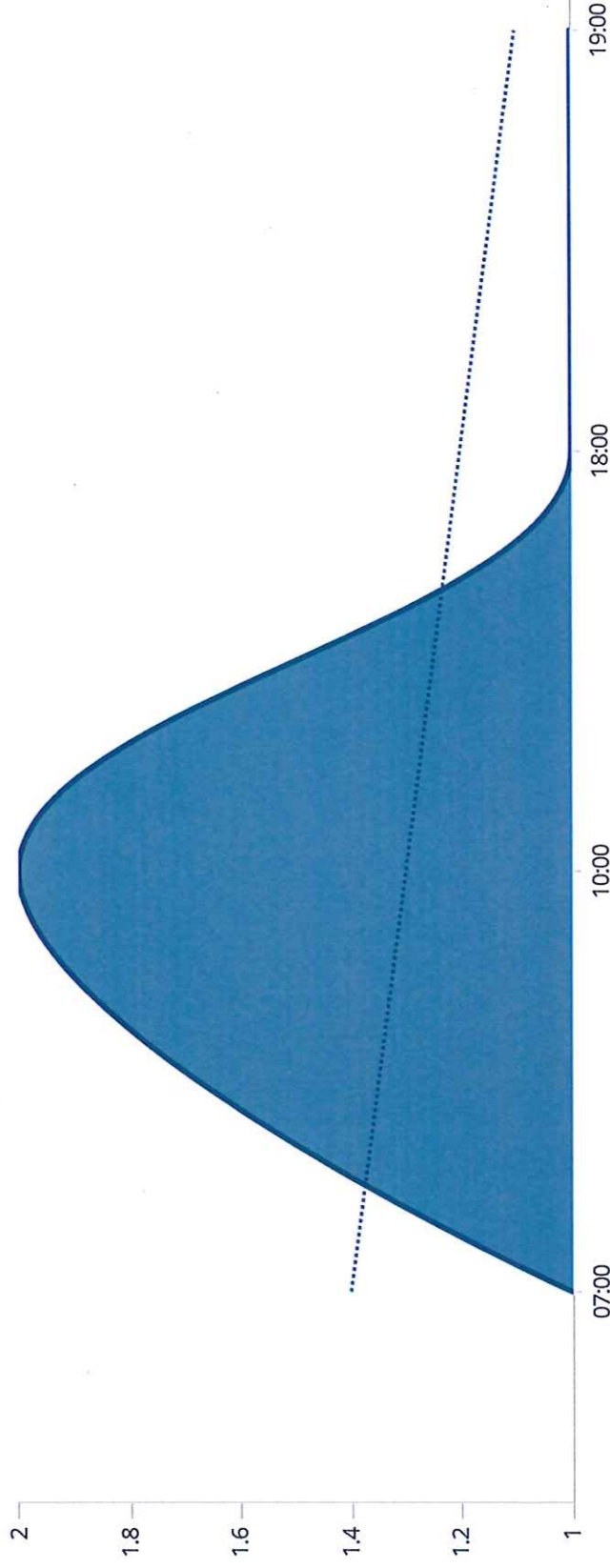

False Alarms over Time



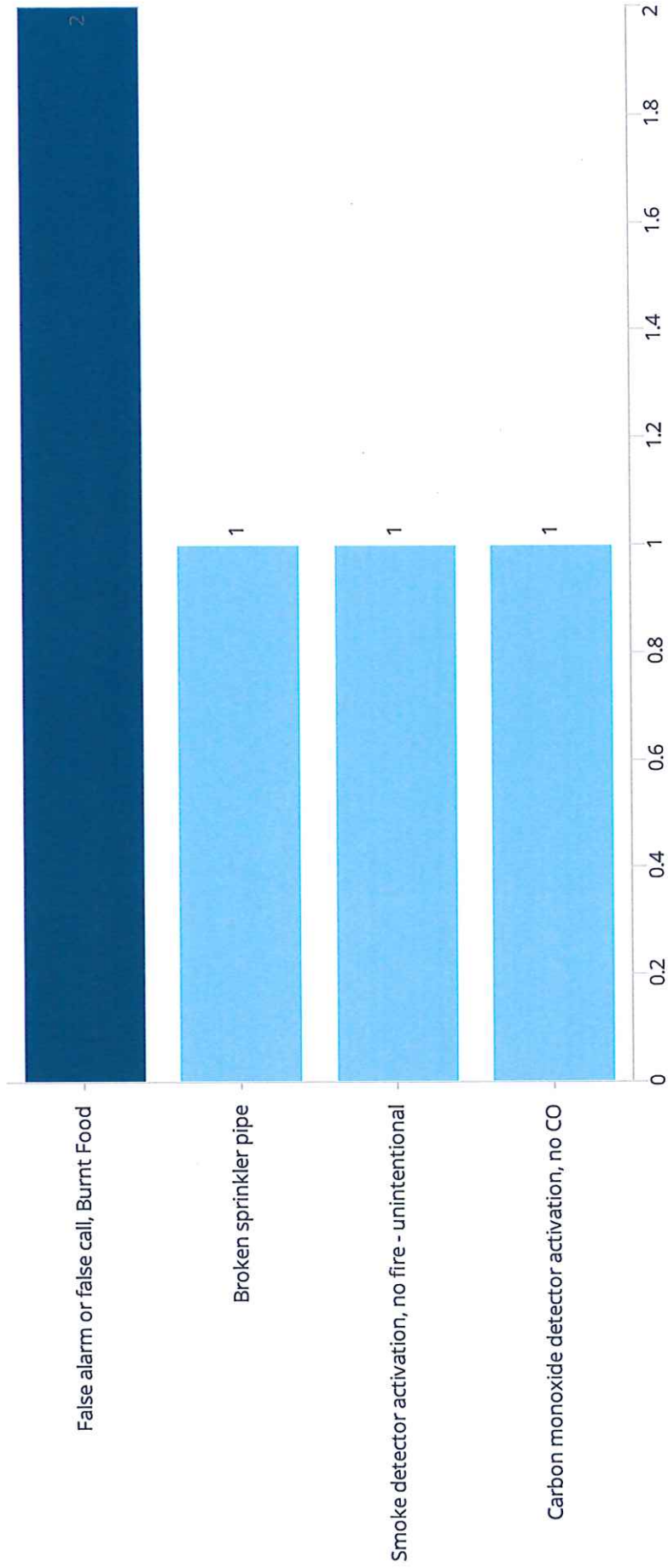

WHEREAS, the Code provides that an International Fire Code Board of Appeals (“Board”) shall be established within the Borough to hear and decide appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the Borough Fire Code Official relative to the application and interpretation of the Code;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Code, the Board shall be appointed by Council, and consist of five (5) voting members having the qualifications established by the Code, and after the initial terms expire, members shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years, and no member shall be reappointed to serve more than two (2) consecutive full terms;

WHEREAS, Council now desires to establish the Board and appoint the initial members to the Board.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of West Conshohocken, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, that the following individuals are appointed to the Board for the following initial terms:

1. **Albert M. Comly, Jr.** is appointed to serve as a Board member for a term of three (3) years until 2027;
2. **Daniel Hinkle** is appointed to serve as a Board member for a term of two (2) years until 2026;
3. **Stephen McManus** is appointed to serve as a Board member for a term of two (2) years until 2026;
4. **Jason Scholl** is appointed to serve as a Board member for a term of one (1) year until 2025;

5. **Herron Duke** is appointed to serve as a Board member for a term of one (1) year until 2025.
