Mr. Blumenthal acknowledged and thanked everyone surrounding the Memorial Day and 150th Event, and also recognized Mr. Rockett on the number of responses to fire calls this past month. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that the Borough continues to grow and also indicated that a new officer, Officer Rucker, was sworn in and hope he will be available at the July meeting. Mr. Blumenthal also acknowledged interim Chief Carfagno for his leadership as well as the Mayor and all committee members for their continued attention.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

There were no Council objections therefore the approval of the agenda passes unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE AGENDA ITEMS

Walter Gleba, resident, congratulated Dr. Borgerson on his one-year anniversary of being hired with the Borough as Assistant Manager. Mr. Gleba asked that the MacKenzie Park plans be clarified and put on the website for everyone to see. Mr. Hassan addressed Mr. Gleba and indicated that the plans will be updated as Grant Process is approved. Councilmember Conicello- Emery also indicated that the plans are on the website and also indicated its color coded and phases are listed.

Guy Davis, resident, welcomed Mr. Marr and also thanked Mr. Curran for all of his hard work on the Planning Commission.

APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

Mr. Blumenthal indicated that the Consent Agenda includes committee reports and without objections, the Consent Agenda was approved unanimously.

PROFESSIONAL REPORTS

Mr. English indicated that the report is in the packet and Mr. English wanted to update members of the community that the Borough is looking to replace the rubber surface at St. Gert's tot lot that is around the playground equipment. A quote was received at \$6,847.60 from Surface Pros and work would begin in a few weeks. Many quotes were received as high as 9,000. To replace the entire concrete surface would be \$54,000. Councilmember Gale questioned if repair is okay or would need to be replaced. Mr. Hassan discussed further information on the work to be done for the surface. Councilmember Gorney asked about lifespan/warranty of this repair and Mr. Hassan indicated that the previous work was done 15 years ago. This material has a non-shrink bond.

Mr. John Iannozzi had nothing to report

Mr. Khal Hassan had two requests this evening for Council for bidding.

Church Street drainage. The design has been completed and the next step is putting this project out for bid. Mr. Hassan indicated that the bid results will be discussed at next Council meeting. Mr. Blumenthal asked for a motion to bid this project.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

Walter Gleba, resident, wanted to recognize the George Clay Fire Company especially the information regarding the EV charging stations and protecting our community. Mr. Gleba indicated that Community Day is scheduled for August 17th and is asking that Bullock Ave be paved. Mr. Gleba indicated that the meeting from last month that Engineers and DCR reviewed and approved the walkway at MacKenzie Park and then steepness by the woods and indicates that this in violation of our slope ordinance. Mr. Gleba wanted to know if anyone has gone to visit that location and cleaning up vegetation in that area and wanted to know if DCNR went to visit that site. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that staff is taking notes and will address them accordingly.

Page Three of Five, Council Meeting Minutes, June 11, 2024

Jim Goggin, wanted to address the traffic on Moorehead and painting the box. Mr. Goggin wanted to follow up on the water issue that was published and asked if anyone contacted Aqua. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that the item that Mr. Goggin was addressing was a paid advertisement article and Mr. Blumenthal did investigate this matter.

Denise Malecki, resident, asked about the status of her neighbors Right to Know request and would like to request this to be public. Ms. Malecki requested a poll of the votes for Richard Marr and would like to know who spoke to Mr. Marr prior to the last Council meeting. Ms. Malecki thanked the Police Department and wanted to address the conditions of Bullock Ave with paving and safety issues with stop signs, and wanted to address the traffic on Moorehead.

Mr. Blumenthal called on solicitor John Iannozzi regarding the Right to Know. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that the Right to Know will be processed on what the law requires. Mr Iannozzi indicated that the response date to the Right to Know request Ms. Malecki was referring to is the 14th and the response will be going to the Requestor. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that she could ask for a copy from the Requestor or submit a Right to Know for the Right to Know response. Ms. Malecki wanted to clarify that she should either ask the requestor for the documentation or submit another Right to Know request. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that the best policy is to submit a Right to Know with any public entity. Ms. Malecki asked if there was any limitation to posting the documents publicly. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that he is not allowed to provide legal advice on what she is allowed or not allowed to do with the documents, and she is to ask her legal counsel. Mr. Blumenthal asked Tara Gorney to discuss the issues with the light on Moorehead Ave. Councilmember Gorney stated that this light has been discussed at many meetings and the Borough does not control the timing of the lights.

Guy Davis, resident, indicated that there was excessive regulations on the plastic ban ordinance and governing of the Borough and suggests that this be re-evaluated for a business decision. Mr. Davis also suggested there be another committee to evaluate the Borough Codes. Mr. Davis also wanted to know why the plastic bag ordinance was not brought before the Planning Commission.

Joe Williams wanted to know the process on vacancies on Council and committees. Mr. Williams also wanted to address the traffic on Moorehead and recommendations on a stop sign. Mr. Blumenthal explained the openings for Council and Committees with news and notices in the mail and the website. Mr. Blumenthal indicated that Council members do have the right to talk to other members in the community about an opening on Council however there is no discussion between Council for election votes prior to the council meetings. Amelia Gale made a comment that this was the first time she has even met Mr. Marr and Mr. Blumenthal indicated that this is also the first time he has met Mr. Marr. Mr. Blumenthal also wanted to indicate that members of the community do send their letters of interest to the Borough prior. Ms. Gorney also indicated that at every council meeting when there is an opening, there is a series of questions that is asked and the same questions are asked with each applicant. Mr. Marr spoke to advise the public that he was made aware of the opening through the website he submitted his resume, answered questions at the last meeting and was selected.

Mr. Blumenthal indicated that members of Council will move into an Executive Session to discuss personnel matters and will not be returning as there is no action being taken.

II. <u>COMMITTEE REPORT</u>:

Opening Comments/Discussion from Chair about the potential Overlay district. There was a question from residents about the process which was explained by the engineer detailing the process. The first step in the process is to create an RFP/RFQ for local planners to bid on the project.

Park update from Khal:

- Punch list for contractors, 18 months for good season and bad seasons to ensure completion
- Update to website completed last week. Master plan has no improvements changed and shows phases and speaks in detail about the information.
- Phase 2a for advertisement. LSA grant is nearly 1M for entire park. Most of everything that is on the plane. Local share grant that has no match. Can be made available and can be seen via the resolution.
- Grants are always solicited for open space, walkways, direct emails may be sent. Some grants require that we attend one day sessions to be granted.

Lisa Steifiel, resident- can we show phases of the map at a committee meeting? Khal commented that Mackenzie needed improvements and was outdated. It did not have proper equipment with ADA compliance. Point is for residence, Borough programs. Can we add pickle b-ball courts?

-Perhaps aspirational

Does the borough have insurance? -Yes, the Borough has insurance.

Chet G. -Concerns about the ends of the trail being steep. Were representatives from DCNR? Remove topsoil and vegetation and replaced with Does the walking trail conform to Steep slope? Dates lights activated and dusk till dawn?

Denise Maleki - Lights that are facing in. Small light for disabled parking needs to be adjusted - it is shining in her house. Why are we lighting the park? They are on at 10-11 in the evening.

-They are on for safety.

The blacktop of the path is ADA compliant. Going to the left there is a missing piece. Can Khal review and see if we can connect?

-We do not have to make it fully ADA compliant, but we do the best we can. DCNR has vetted our park plans.

What will the parking look like? -Future phase and future grants.






Movie Night MacKenzie Park July 12th at Sunset

Policies & Procedures

- The Police Department's new Policy and Procedures are in the final stages of completion and should be finished in the next few months. Thanks to the Aspirant Consulting Group for their services.

Training

- All Officers are completing their mandatory 2024 Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training (MPOETC) update courses through the year.
- All Officers participate in multiple monthly online training courses through Police One Academy.
- Officers will continue Firearms Training through the remainder of the year.
- The Department will be completing mandatory Taser training.

*** West Conshohocken Police Officer George Brandon Rucker ***

The West Conshohocken Police Department welcomes Officer George Brandon Rucker as their newest Police Officer. Officer Rucker is the Departments first new hire since 2016. He completed all conditional requirements for active duty and started 480 hours of field training. We look forward to Officer Rucker serving the community for many years.

Police Department Police Officer Hiring Process

Civil Service Committee has certified a list of eligible Police Officer candidates from the second round of testing. The West Conshohocken Borough Council and Police Department are carefully reviewing each candidate for potential hires.

New Police Officer Exam

A new Police exam and Physical Agility for the position of Police Officer at the West Conshohocken Police Officer is scheduled for September 7th, 2024 through the Montgomery County Consortium of Communities.

EQUIPMENT

Digital Ticket Devices

The Department completed training on the new E-Ticket handheld devices and data website. The devices and website are scheduled to go online and be operational on July 14th. The E-Ticket devices provide faster service, instant processing at court, limit the use of paper tickets, and store all data on a designated website for the Police Department.

FLEET MANAGEMENT

Police Vehicles

Fleet Management Officers maintain all Police vehicle maintenance records. Records are stored in the Departments web based Fleet Management / GPS System. The system alerts Officers of upcoming scheduled maintenance for all of the Department's vehicles. *(Vehicle mileage, warranties & conditions attached)

All the Department's patrol vehicles, including decals and equipment have completely restored and updated to prolong their usage.

The Community Relations Unit (CRU) and an unmarked Police / Detective vehicle are the last vehicles in the fleet that will be updated and have the equipment upgraded.

TRAFFIC & PARKING

Traffic

The Police Department continues monitoring all of the Borough's traffic areas and any requests by residents for problem traffic areas. Officers conduct multiple traffic details daily throughout the Borough. Please contact the Police Department to report any traffic complaints or concerns.

Permit Parking

Parking permits, renewals or replacement tags are available for purchase or replacement at the West Conshohocken Police Department, Monday through Friday between 8:00am-4:00pm. Applicants must be a resident or business owner, must provide proof of residence or business ownership in the form of a photo identification card and a utility bill. Permits are limited to one per resident or business and one vehicle per resident or business. A \$25.00 registration fee is required each year to obtain a permit.

Any vehicles that park in the Merion Avenue permit parking lot without a valid 2024 permit parking tag assigned to a specific registration is subject to a \$50.00 fine.

Officers monitor, enforce and conduct parking details daily, including the permit parking lot. Please contact the Police Department to report any parking complaints, issues or concerns.










