Tax and Rent Rebate Program

2024-25 Property Tax and Rent Rebate Program application deadline is June 30, 2025.

The June 30, 2025 deadline for submission of the District's property tax and rent rebate program for the 2024-25 fiscal year is quickly approaching. The rebate was unanimously approved by the Upper Merion Area School District Board of School Directors in June of 2024. The rebate includes a rebate of up to \$600 for certain homeowners and renters.

To qualify for this discount, applicants must have a household income of no more than \$45,000 annually (half of Social Security income is excluded), and:

be 65 years of age or older; or be a widow or widower aged 50 years of age or older;

or be permanently disabled and 18 years of age or older.

Please note that this year's program is effective on July 1, 2024 based on taxes paid in 2023.

MESSAGE FROM YOUR CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Here are **5** essential pool safety tips to help ensure a safe swimming environment for everyone:

- 1. **Supervise Children at All Times-** Never leave children unattended near a pool. Designate a responsible adult to watch swimmers, especially younger kids or inexperienced swimmers.
- 2. **Install Barriers and Alarms-** Use a minimum four-foot-high fence with a self-latching gate around the pool. Pool alarms and safety covers can provide added protection against unsupervised access.
- 3. **Learn CPR and Basic First Aid-** Knowing how to perform CPR and administer first aid can save lives. Make sure all supervising adults are trained.
- 4. **Enforce Pool Rules-** Set and enforce rules such as no running, no diving in shallow areas, and no swimming without adult supervision. Clear guidelines help prevent accidents.
- 5. **Keep Rescue Equipment Nearby-** Have a life ring, a reaching pole, and a phone within reach in case of emergency. These tools can be critical in responding quickly to an incident.
